





#### Immigrants Honored in Parkrose



Miles of farmland tilled by immigrants once surrounded what is now a traffic median dividing Northeast 98th Avenue and Sandy Boulevard, the site chosen for a bronze statue installed last week for the 100th anniversary of the Parkrose community.

The life-size statute is a historic symbol honoring Portland's lifelong immigrant populations.

Attending the unveiling were the creators and backers of the project, well-known Portland artist Jim Gion, who molded and sculpted the piece from clay and bronze; foundry owner Jim Calcagano; and the project's director, Joe Rossi.

The Rossi family emigrated from Italy and was one of three families that once owned a majority of the farmland in the Parkrose area.

The project's information booklet calls the statue "an everlasting symbol to Portland's gratitude for the contributions of our immigrant citizens," and the statue site, "an ideal location," viewable from the thousand of vehicles that buzz by daily in four directions.
