Oklahoma! -- Portland Center Stage presents a new produc-



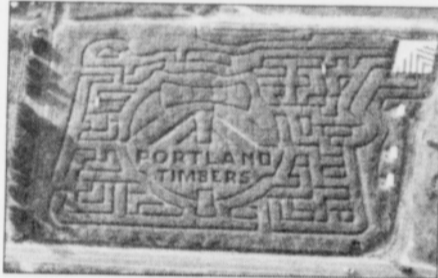

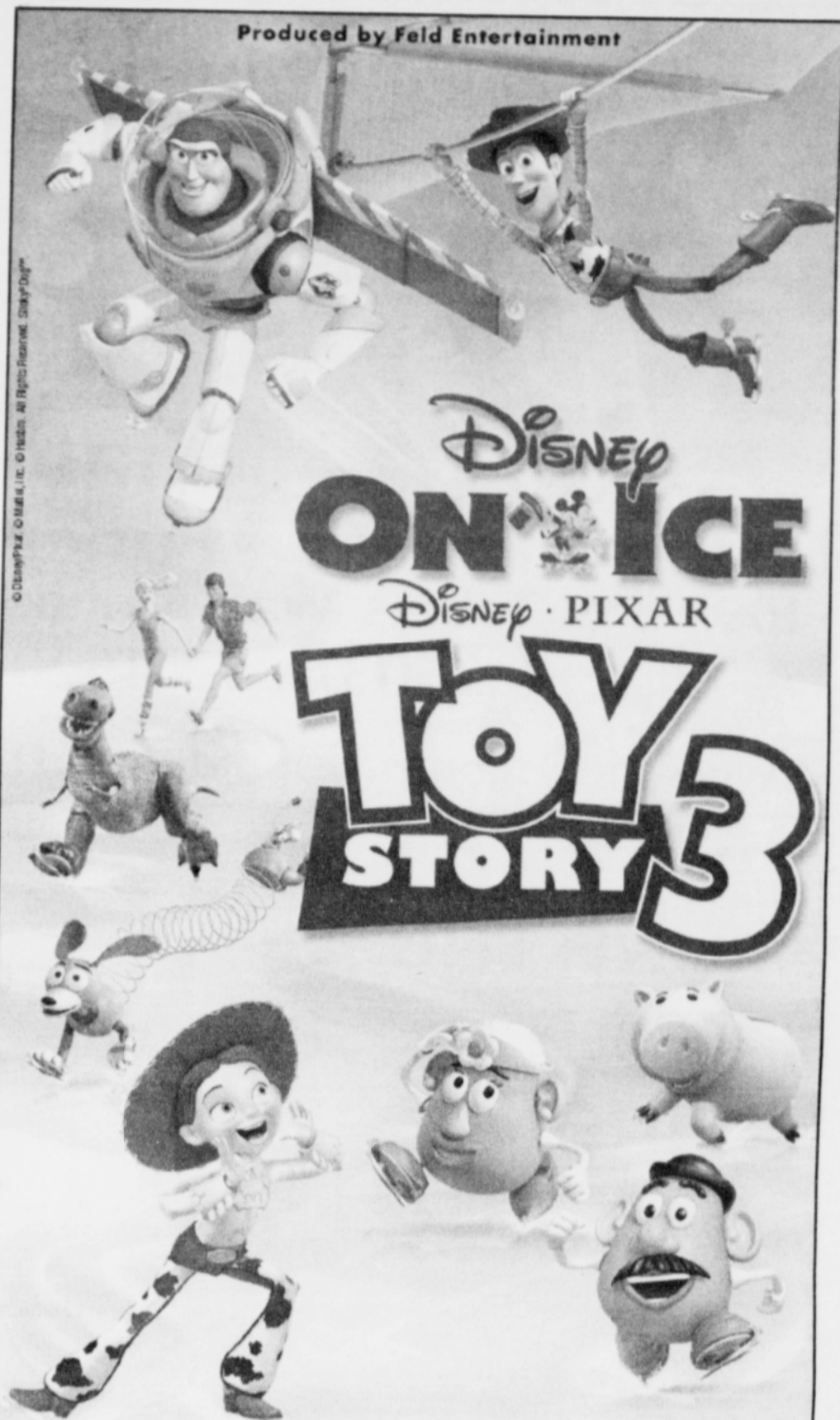
