Exploring the Body and Brain

All-new Body Worlds exhibition at OMSI

The Oregon Museum of Science and Industry announces its newest featured exhibition, Gunther von Hagens' BODY WORLDS and The Brain, opening to the public on Thursday, Oct. 20 for a limited engagement.

The show deciphers the mystery and complexity of the human body and brain with more than 200 authentic human specimens—including entire bodies, individual organs, and transparent body slices—preserved

through Plastination, Dr. von Hagens' revolutionary preservation method.

The exhibition highlights the neuroscience research on brain development, performance, disease, and disorders.

OMSI hosted the Pacific Northwest debut of Body Worlds in 2007. The exhibition made history at the museum with a total of nearly 400,000 visitors during its four-month run.

Special prices for advance purchase tickets through Oct. 19 are \$12 for children, \$16 for students & seniors and \$19 for adults.
