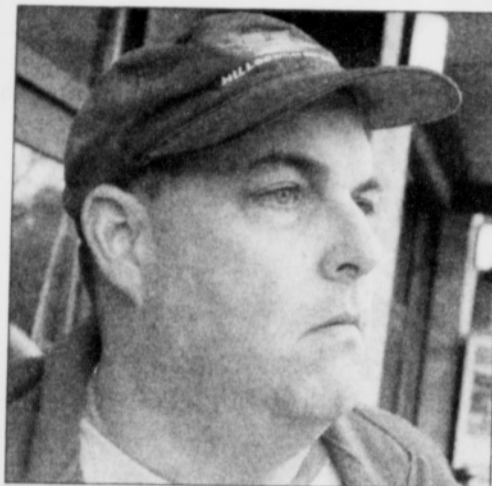

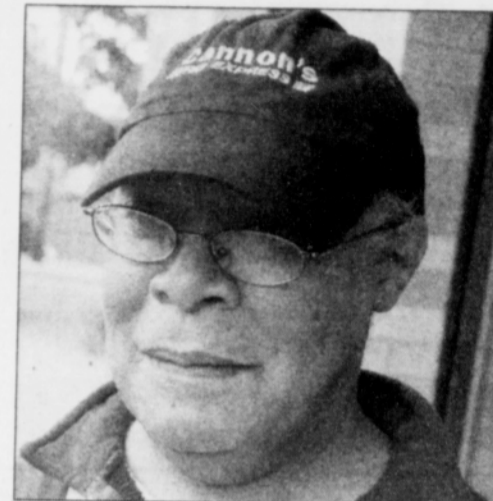

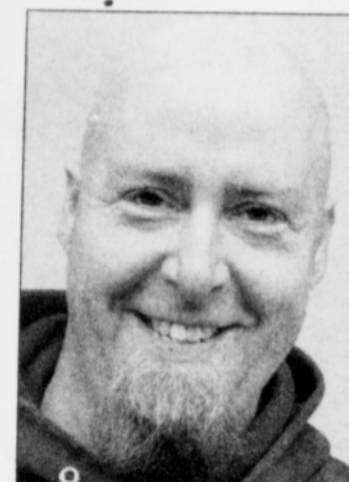
"It's a remembrance for all of the people who have fallen. I'm going to hang out with my grandfather who was in the Korean War. That is what I usually do. We are a big service family."

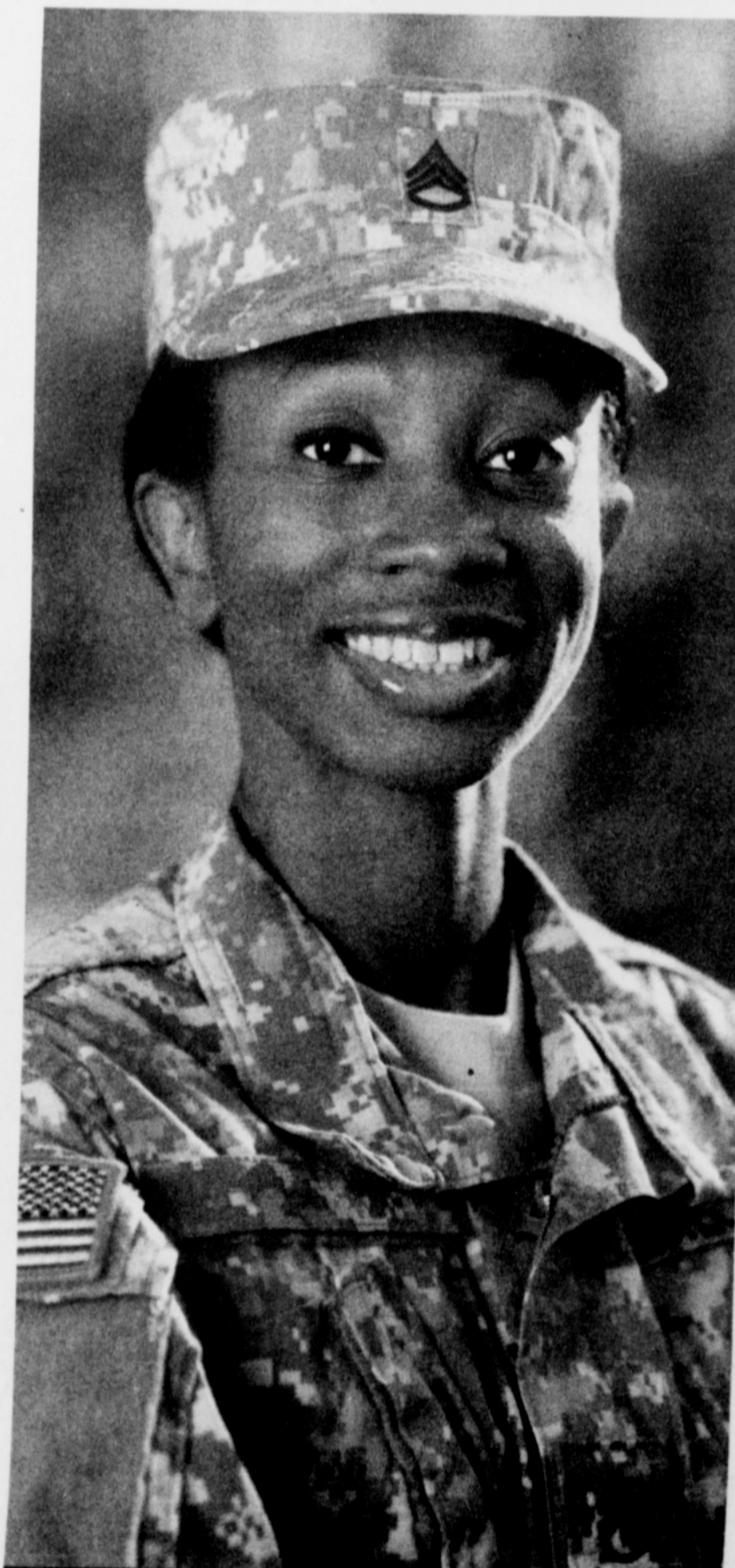
"It gives me a chance to reflect on my friends on active duty or those that have been in war or conflict. It's no longer about the older wars; what comes to mind are my friends that have participated."
