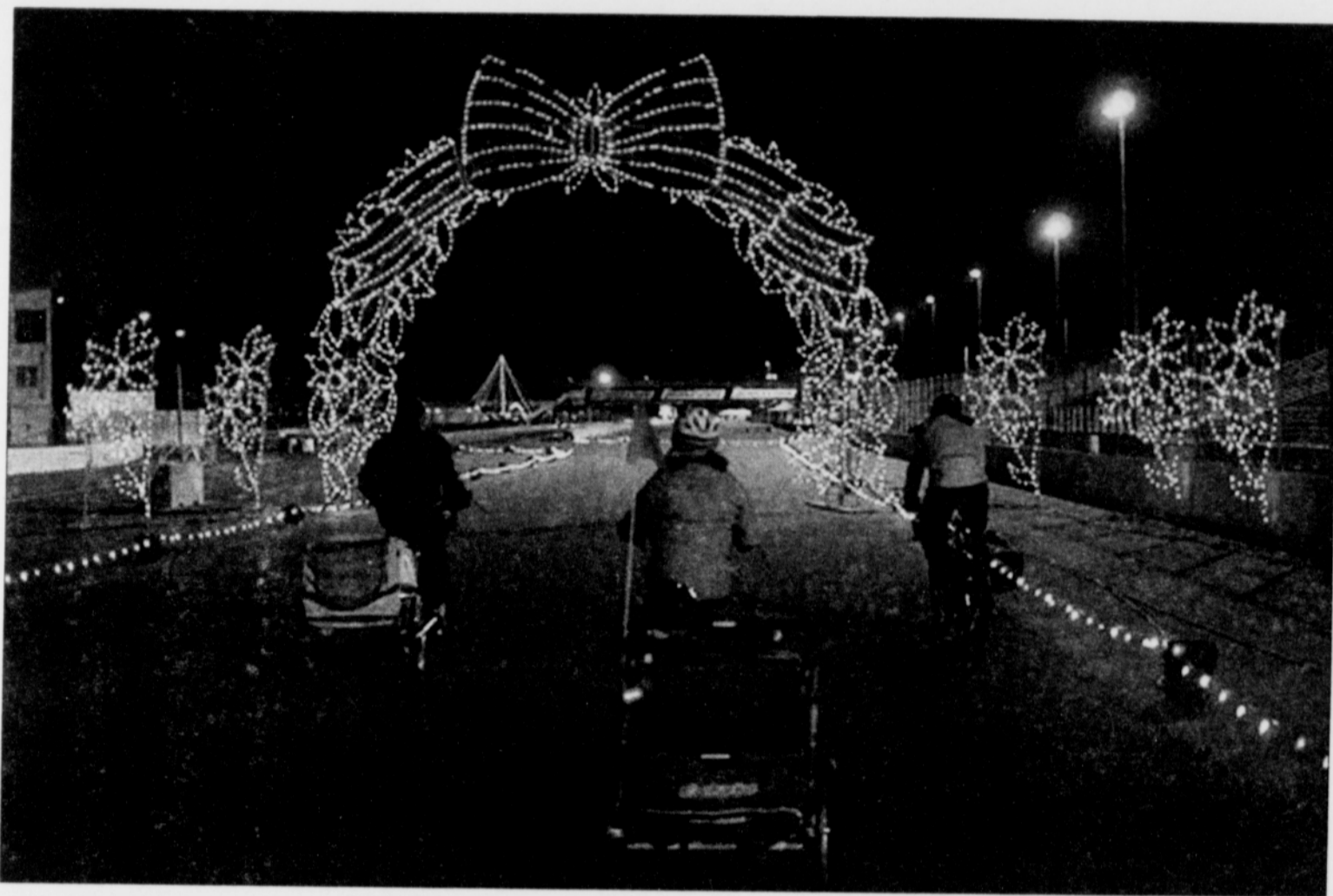

## Winter Wonderland Opens 19th Season

One of the region's favorite holiday traditions, Jubitz Winter Wonderland powered by Comcast, returns for its 19th season beginning Thanksgiving Day and running through Christmas at Portland International Raceway in north Portland.

The largest drive-through ani-

mated light show in the Northwest attracts more than 100,000 people annually who view spectacular displays of lights and animation from the comfort of their personal vehicles and tour buses.

A number of special events will return this year, including a run and walk on Saturday, Nov. 26; a "dogs

night out" for pet lovers on Monday, Nov. 28; and a convoy night with a dazzling parade of decorated trucks from the Jubitz Travel Center on Monday, Dec. 12.

Rates are \$16 for each car load, and discount coupons are available at Jubitz. The event runs through Christmas Day.

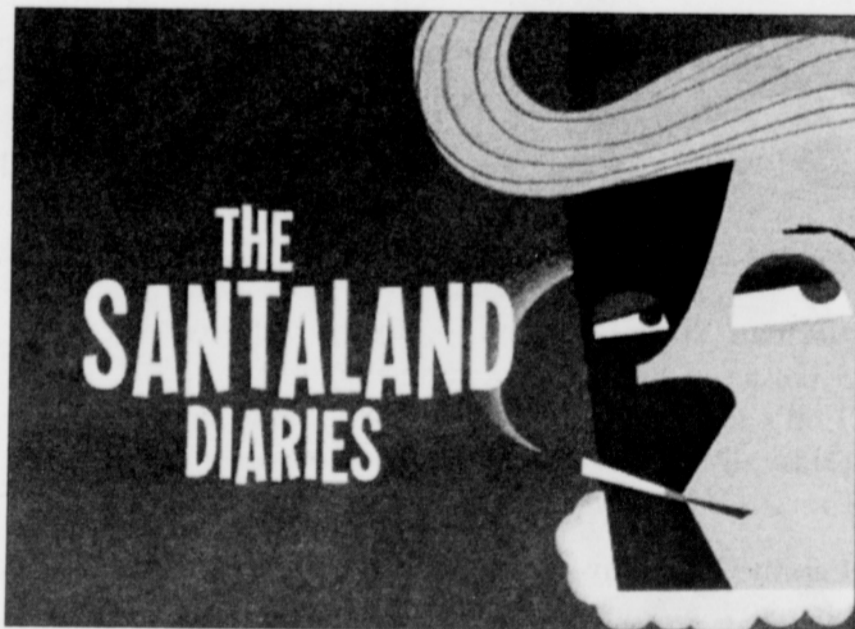
## Comedy is Anti-Holiday Classic Portland Center Stage's fresh coat of naughtiness

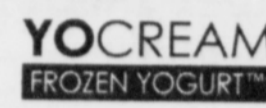

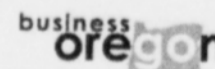
