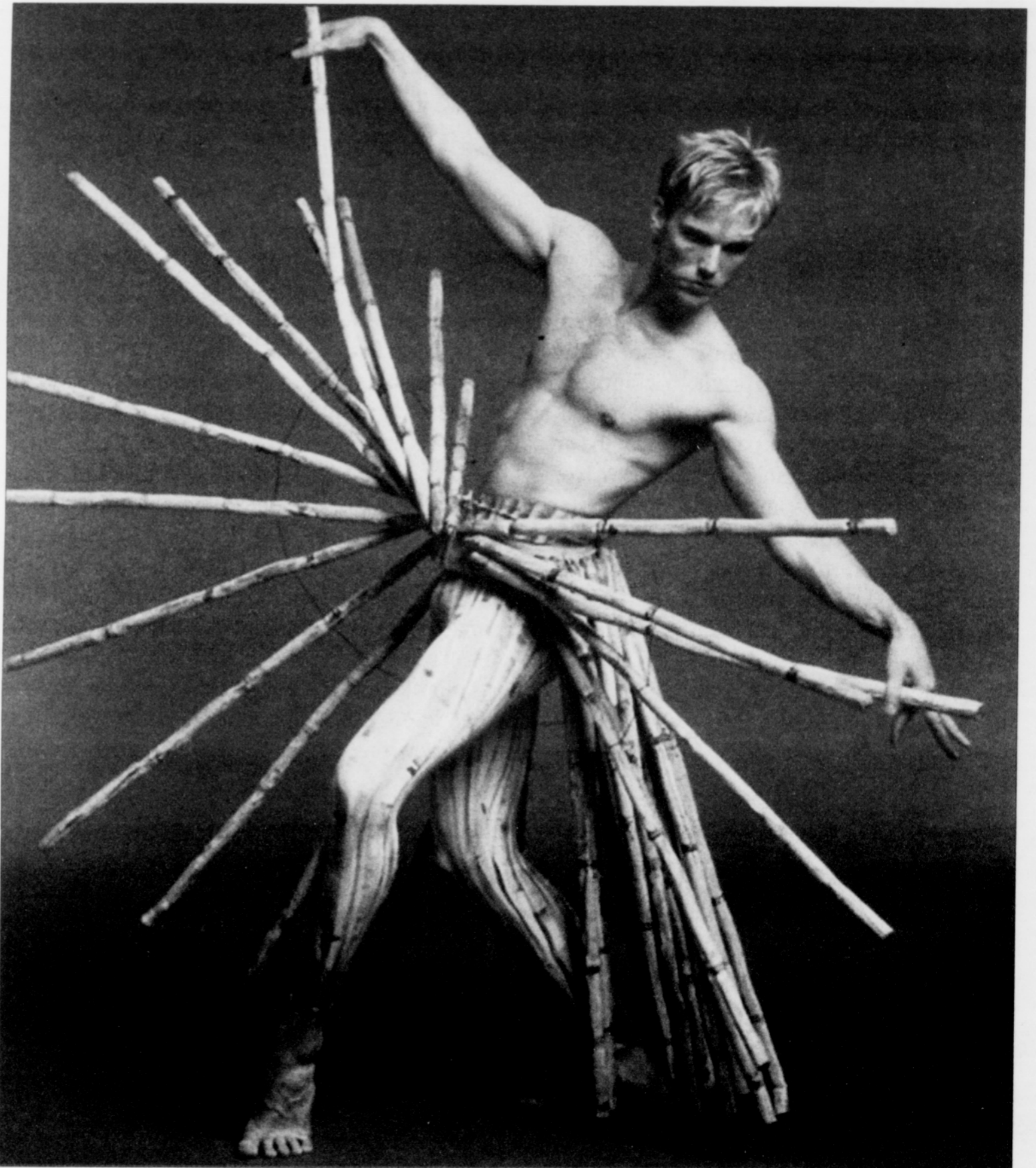

Trey McIntyre Project set to Roy Orbison

Portland's White Bird Dance Series presents the return of the Trey McIntyre Project, one of the most in-demand acclaimed dance companies in the United States.

Artistic Director Trey McIntyre has choreographed more than 90 works for ballet companies around the world, including six ballets for Oregon Ballet Theatre.

His 10-member company, based in Boise, will perform an exhilarating program that draws inspiration

from dreams, musical legends, the daring 'gravity heroes' of Niagara Falls, and New Orleans's intriguing culture, set to stirring scores by Roy Orbison, Antony & the Johnsons, and New Orleans' Preservation Hall Jazz Band.

The evening begins with *In Dreams*, set to Orbison's spare romantic ballads.

Performances are at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Dec. 1, through Saturday, Dec. 3 at the Newmark Theatre, downtown. Tickets start at \$26 and are available at whitebird.org and the Portland Center for the Performing Arts Box Office.
