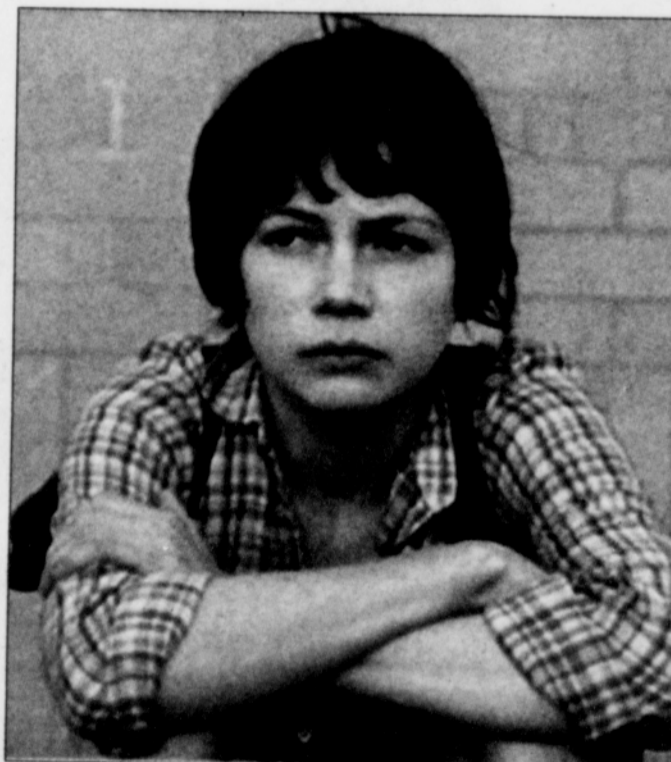

Jobless, Hungry and Fed Up

People are jobless, hungry and just plain fed up. These are hard times. The Hollywood Theater will bring filmmakers Kelly Reichardt and Jon Raymond to the northeast Portland venue Saturday for double feature exploring themes of economic hardship and the resilience of the human spirit.

The screenings of "The Grapes of Wrath" and "Wendy and Lucy," both presented in 35mm, will begin at 7 p.m. Reichardt and Raymond will be present to introduce each film.

"Wendy and Lucy" is based on a short story by Raymond that follows Wendy over a few days in a strange town during which her life takes a series of dives.

Widely considered one of director John Ford's masterpieces, "The Grapes of Wrath" has enthralled audiences since its premier in 1940. Don't miss a rare opportunity to see this masterpiece of classical Hollywood as it was intended on 35mm film.
