### Sunshine Division boxes up food for needy families

Known throughout the metro-area for their holiday food boxes, the non-profit Sunshine Division, in partnership with the Portland Police Bureau, has provided emergency food and clothing relief to Portland families year-round for more than 88-years.

Hundreds of volunteers have gathered at the group's north Portland warehouse in the past few weeks to prepare boxes of food for the holiday season, which will feed more than 3,500 families in time for Christmas.

The final push came last Wednesday during "Pack Night" when residents of all ages formed an efficient assembly line to prepare the donations for delivery.

For Gina Jackson, 52, this is her eighth-year as a Sunshine Division volunteer.

"I feel very blessed and honored I can be a part of this," she said. "I brought my grandson."

### Lesson Delivered in Sharing the Road

#### Crosswalk enforcement brings awareness

In an effort to raise awareness on traffic safety and traffic law, the Portland Bureau of Transportation and the Portland Police Bureau held a crosswalk enforcement event last Wednesday at North Killingsworth and Commercial Avenue.

The effort, which occurs in various locations within the city throughout the year, includes a

pedestrian decoy at crosswalks. Those who fail to stop, including car-drivers and bicyclists, may be issued a warning or citation from the police.

"The main thing is education," said Sharon White, program specialist with the Portland Bureau of Transportation. She explained that some of the locations for the events are requested by members of the
