

Italian trumpet icon Enrico Rava with special guest the Tony Pacini Trio will bring an Italian-themed night of jazz to Winningstad Theatre, downtown, on Saturday, Feb. 18 at 7:30 p.m. as part of the U.S. Bank Portland Jazz Festival presented by Alaska Airlines.

Rava, one of the most accomplished and internationally recognized musicians from Italy, will make his Portland debut on the festival's opening weekend.

At an early age, Rava traded in his trombone for a trumpet after hearing Miles Davis, whose influence is obvious in Rava's music.

The Tony Pacini Trio, a longstanding Portland tradition featuring bassist Ed Bennett, and drummer Mel Brown, will play
