she had initially anticipated. Over time quite a few immigrants surveyed were able to make lateral transitions to jobs comparable to those held before immigration, and a few who took on positions with lower responsibility elected to keep those "lower stress" positions.

Drawing on the idea of unseen figures moving from place to place, uncertain of where

they will be led next, Clotheslines will document the variety of profession transitions that immigrants have volunteered to share with the artist. Visitors will be encouraged to find a path through the maze as they read and share the identity shift experience that immigration demands.

Viewing hours are from 7 am to 6 pm, Monday through Friday. The Portland Building is located at 1120 S.W. Fifth Ave.
