Portland Parks & Recreation is helping send two deserving students to college through its Early Adventures in Golf for a Lifetime of Enjoyment (EAGLE) program and the Western Golf Association's Evans Foundation Scholarship.

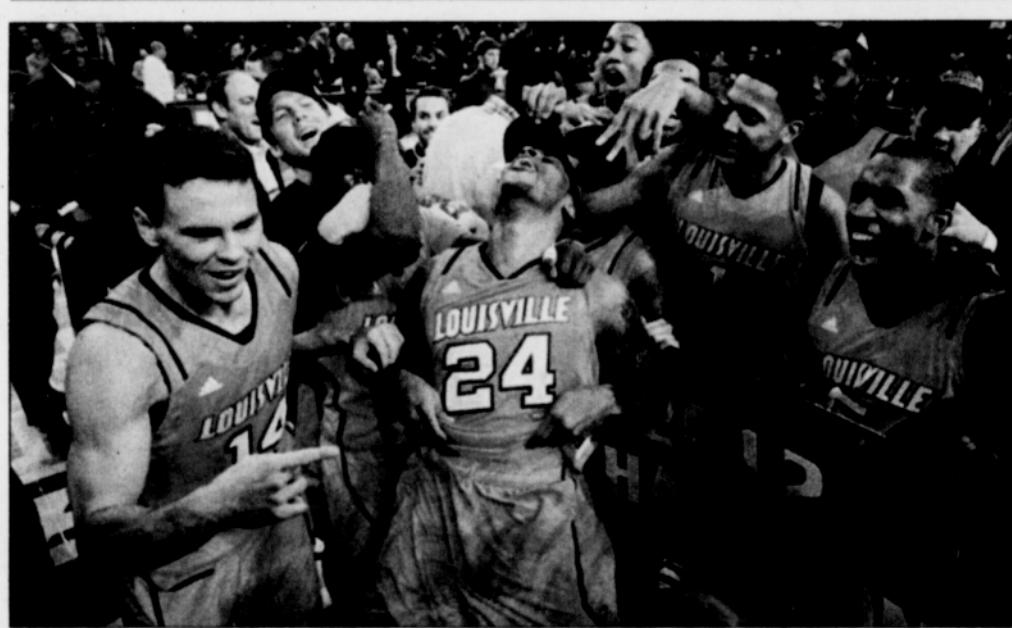
