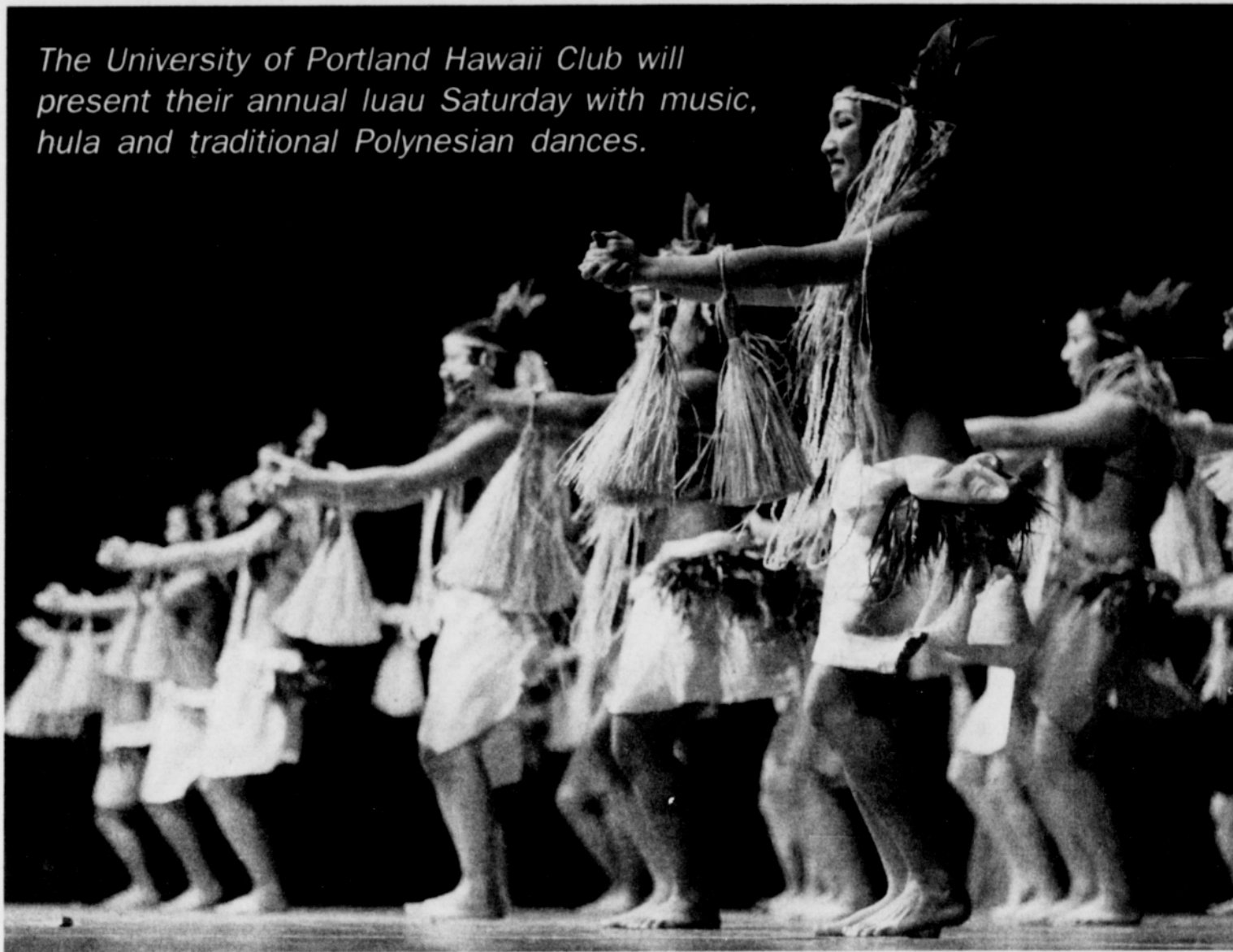


The University of Portland Hawaii Club will present their annual luau Saturday with music, hula and traditional Polynesian dances.
