'Flash Mob' Theft at Lloyd Center

Portland police responded to a "flash mob" theft at Nordstrom Lloyd Center on Friday, April 13, when employees reported multiple young people, ages 13 to 19, who entered the store and began putting items in their bags.

Witnesses said the group consisted of approximately 10 African American male teens wearing hats and hoodies, so their faces were covered.

Once in the store, they began taking items and putting them in bags, and then ran out the Southwest doors of Nordstrom towards Northeast 9th Avenue.



Although officers on the scene recovered some stolen items, no arrests have been made at this time.

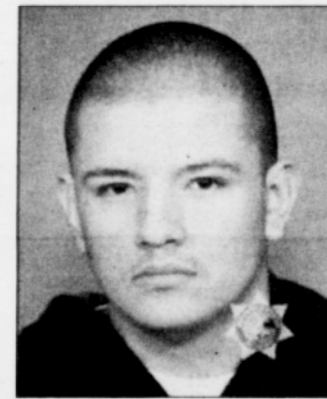

Gang Detectives Make 2011 Stabbing Arrest

The Portland Police Gang Enforcement Team, assisted by the Beaverton Police Department, ar-

rested 18-year-old Miguel Vargas on Thursday April 12, in connection with a September 2011 stabbing in Northeast Portland.

On September 23, 2011, Vargas was involved in an altercation with 19-year-old Christopher Shoop-Lockett on the MAX platform at the Gateway Transit Center, where he stabbed Shoop-Lockett mul-

multiple times before fleeing the area.

Gang Detectives determined the victim and suspect were from rival gangs, and arrested Vargas, who is currently booked in Multnomah County Jail with charges of Attempted Murder

and Assault in the Second Degree.

Bail is set at \$500,000.

Hit and Run Fatality

Portland Police are asking for the public's help in identifying suspects in Sunday's fatal hit and run, which took the life of a 63-year-old resident.

On Saturday, March 31, at approximately 11:20 p.m., Portland Police officers responded to the report of someone lying in the road on in the 2800 block of West Burnside Street.

Arriving officers and medical personnel located 63-year-old Nancy Margaret Schoeffler, who was already deceased of her injuries.

Traffic investigators have determined that Schoffler was crossing West Burnside Street on foot when she was struck by a vehicle, which fled the area westbound on Burnside.

The vehicle of interest is described as a late 90s-early 2000's black or dark green Honda Accord sedan with damage to the hood and front windshield that was seen in the QFC parking lot at Southwest Barnes Road and Miller Road, where two women

were seen arguing 2 miles West of the crash location.

The women are described as two white females in their mid to late 20s, blonde hair, short and stocky, wearing baseball caps, possibly with Portland Timbers logos on the caps.

The damage to the car is described as being more consistent with hitting a person rather than a pole or tree.

Crime Stoppers is offering a cash reward of up to \$1,000 for information reported to Crime Stoppers that leads to an arrest in this case or any unsolved felony. You can remain anonymous.
