The IMAX film invites audiences to venture across floating ice to witness one mother polar bear's determination to keep her cubs alive in the face of natural predators and a rapidly changing climate.

The stunning beauty of the Arctic is palpable in this giant-screen film that aims to cultivate a sense of our connectedness, relevance, and impact on this spe-

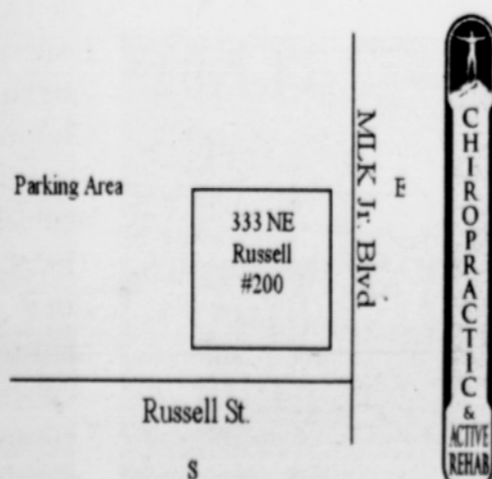
