## Video clinic links care with state workforce

Gov. John Kitzhaber cut the ceremonial ribbon to mark the opening of Providence's innovative new video health care clinic, the Providence Health eXpress.

The new worksite clinic is located inside the Bureau of Labor and Industries building in Salem, as part of an ongoing partnership with Providence and the Public Employ-

ees' Benefit Board.

At Providence Health eXpress, public employees with minor complaints can see a board-certified clinician by secure video. The goal

is to diagnose and treat the employee quickly, so they can get right back to work.

"This is a great example of how we can reorganize the health care delivery system to be more cost effective," said Kitzhaber at last week's ceremony. "In this model, it really changes how individuals receive health care."

"This partnership is an example of how teamwork can really trans-

form health care," said Greg Van Pelt, chief executive for Providence Health & Services in Oregon. "This is a natural extension of our pioneering spirit, not just in Oregon, but for the entire country."

Providence Health eXpress offers health care that is private, secure, fast and convenient. The clinic's medical professionals can

# PCC Enrollment Climbs Again

## Cascade Campus leads growth

For the 19th consecutive term, Portland Community College has grown.

This spring term, the college grew by 3.9 percent in credit enrollment to a total of 9,644 full-time equivalent students or 3.5 percent in total

headcount to 45,967 students.

The figures come from the college's fourth week report on enrollment, the standard week for reporting enrollment to the state.

The Cascade Campus at 705 N. Killingsworth St. has experienced the biggest growth, a trend that
