Markets, and the African-American Alliance for Home Ownership.

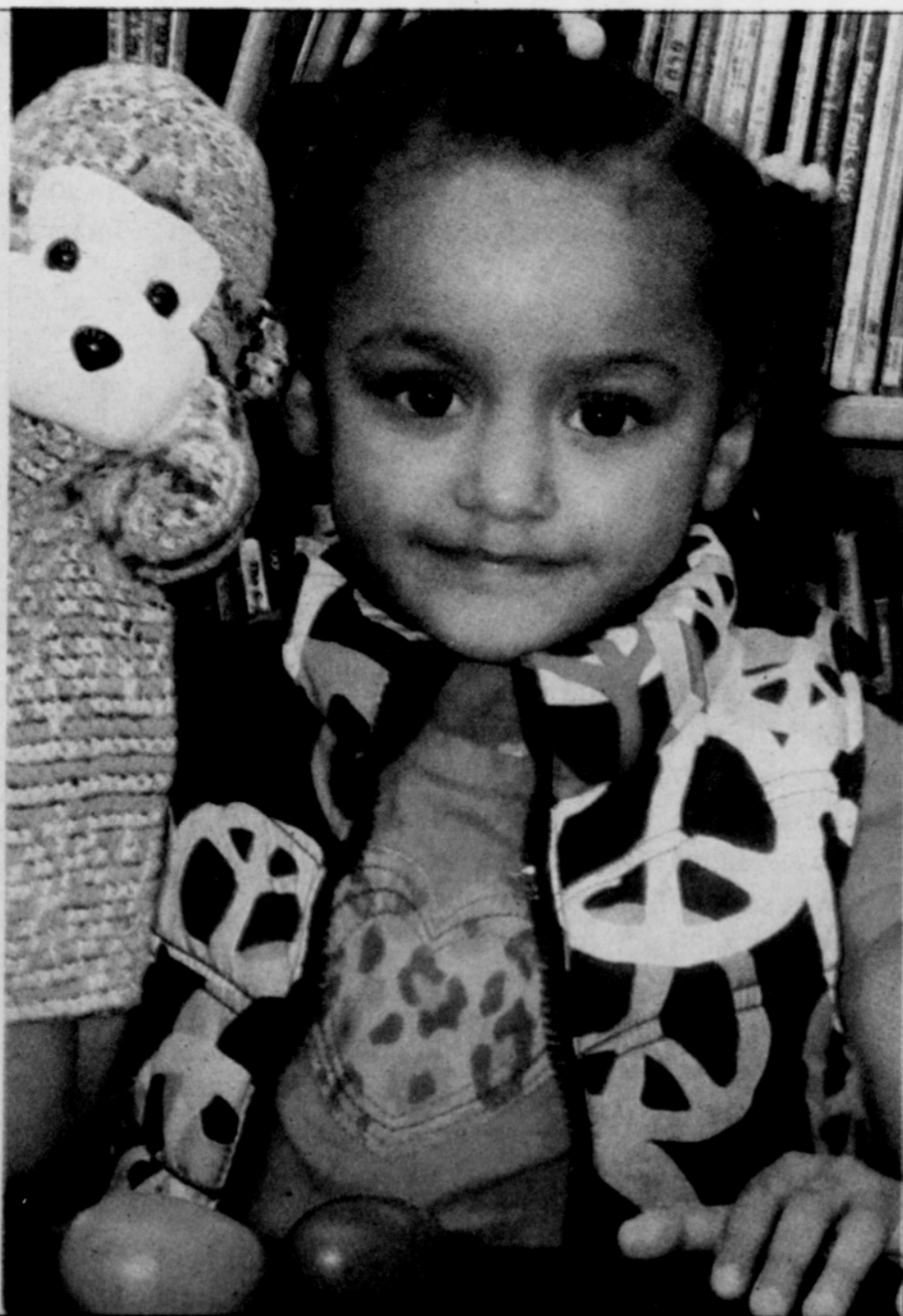
"Even in these hard times, the community continues to support this festival," Roberts said.
