The Week in Review

Immigration Decision

The Supreme Court struck down key provisions of Arizona's crack-down on immigrants Monday, but did not throw out the provision requiring police to check the immigration status of someone they suspect is in the U. S. illegally. The justices, however, said the state law could be subject to additional legal challenges.

Max Attacker Sentenced

A man who punched and kicked a teenage boy in the head at the Interstate Rose Quarter MAX platform last January because he was upset at how slow the youth was walking through a crosswalk was sentenced to more than three years of prison Monday. Quincy Wynn, 26, apologized saying he didn't know the youth was just 15.

Rose Quarter Hit and Run

A Rose Quarter parking lot security guard was injured Tuesday morning in a hit-and-run incident. A balding white man, possibly in his 30s, drove an older model white Ford Explorer into the employee when she confronted him about parking in the closed facility.



Dock Dismantling Plans

The Japanese dock, which was ripped loose by last year's tsunami before making its way to the Oregon coast, will be removed by a Vancouver company. The dismantling will begin next week. The state rejected other plans to float the dock over environmental concerns.

Abuse Death Observed

The flag of the City of Portland will be lowered at City Hall on Monday, July 2, in honor of 5-year-old child abuse victim Mahanarye Noa. This will mark the ninth time the flag has been lowered since a resolution was approved in April 2009 to lower the flag to commemorate Portland children who die as a result of abuse, neglect or homicidal violence.



Crash Kills Woman

Carrie Ann Hill, 36, of Vancouver, was killed Friday while driving on Northeast Lombard Street near 42nd Avenue. Investigators determined that a pickup was westbound on Lombard when the driver crossed over the center line, crashing into the victim's car and a third vehicle.
