


Art on the Boulevard

Free waterfront concert set for Thursday

One of Portland's favorite anevents—the Oregon Symphony's free Waterfront Concert—is set for Thursday, Aug. 30.

Each year thousands of people of all ages pick their spots on the grass beside the Willamette River at Tom McCall Waterfront Park, bring their blankets, their families and their picnics to help Music Director Carlos Kalmar and the Oregon Symphony kick off the symphony season in spectacular Portland fashion.

This year the Symphony is pleased to share the summer spotlight once again with the Portland Youth Philharmonic, led by Music Director David Hattner, who takes the stage at 5 p.m., and the Oregon Ballet Theatre which will perform the Black Swan pas de deux from Swan Lake (featuring dancers Yuka Iino and Brian Simcoe) during the symphony's 7 p.m. concert.
