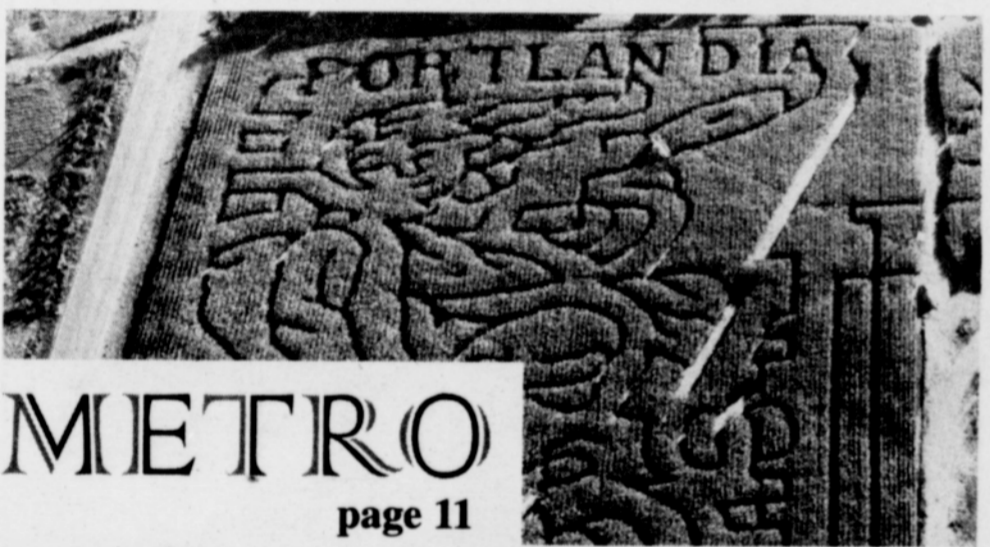

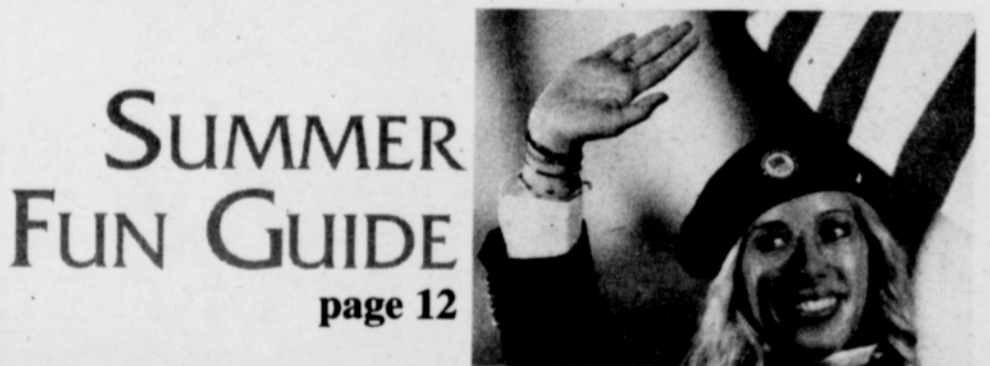

Undocumented immigrants rally in Portland to 'come out of the shadows' and give voice for political and legal changes.

Out of the Shadows

Speaking out against anti-immigrant policies

Community activists stood in solidarity against anti-immigration policies and gave a voice to undocumented individuals who reside in Multnomah County during a rally Thursday in front of the Immigrations Customs Enforcement build-

ing, downtown. Because of police enforcement and other legal repercussions, many undocumented immigrants live in fear of deportation from a community they consider home. The rally served as an opportunity for about 30 individuals to 'come out of the shadows' to give voice for political

and legal changes. "Living in fear doesn't help our families," said Jaime Limon-Guzman, an organizer of the event and local activist.

Wearing a shirt, which read "Undocumented, Unashamed, Un-

McCoy Guilty of Bribes

Former city parking manager awaits sentencing

Ellis K. McCoy, 61, pleaded guilty Thursday to accepting \$184,500 bribes in connection with his former employment as manager of parking operations for the city of Portland.

McCoy admitted that from January 2002 through July 2011, he accepted checks and cash totaling approximately \$164,500, and gifts and travel valued up to \$20,000, paid by executives of two companies who supplied smart parking meters and other services to the city. Neither the executives nor their companies were identified.

McCoy also pleaded guilty to filing false federal income tax
