Portland Playhouse, King Neighbors Host Voter Drive

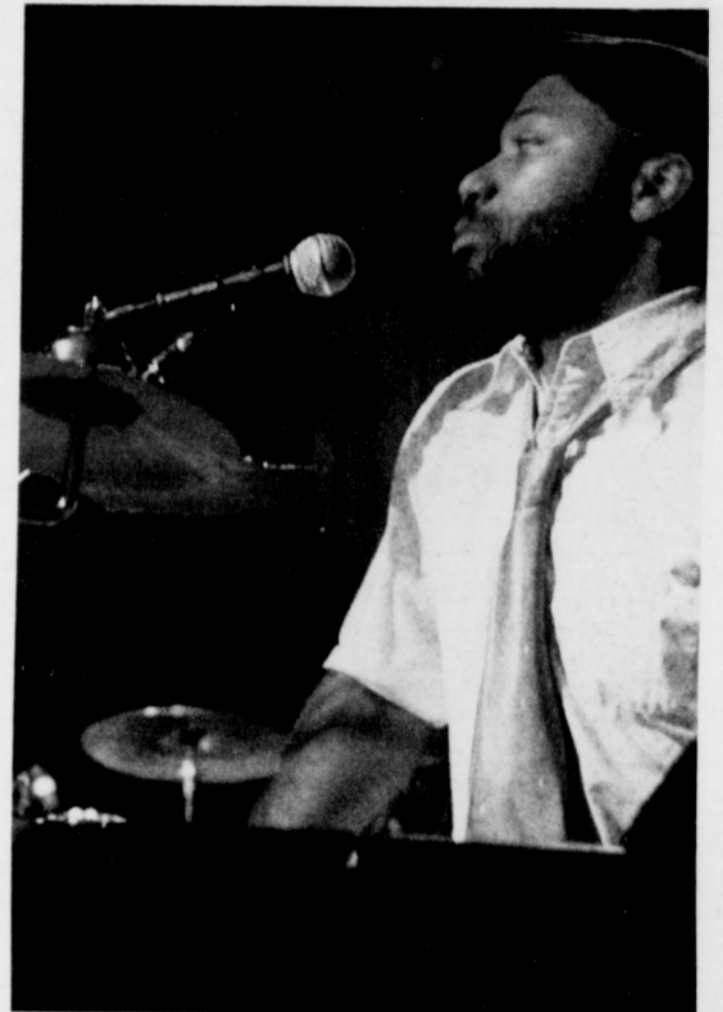
