Help ^{with} Street Trees

Non-profit offers low cost and free planting

Portland's Friends of Trees is asking homeowners in north and northeast Portland to sign-up for trees to plant this fall and winter in their neighborhood, but for those who can't afford the cost, the local non-profit is offering scholarships.

To plant a tree in one of the 25

local neighborhoods where Friends of Trees is planting this year, the cost ranges from \$35 to \$75, except in the Eliot and Portsmouth neighborhoods, where street trees are free.

Costs include the price of the tree, delivery, hole digging, planting assistance, stakes, and fol-

low-up maintenance checks. You'll also be invited to join a neighborhood potluck after the planting.

If the cost is more than residents can afford, Friends of Trees welcomes folks to sign up for a scholarship by calling 503-595-0212.

You can also help others beautify their neighborhood by donating to the scholarship fund at the non-profit group's website friendsoftrees.org.

Each neighborhood has one planting per year, and sign-up deadlines are approximately five weeks before each planting event.

Plantings are scheduled in

the Alameda, Arbor Lodge, Beaumont-Wilshire, Boise, Cathedral Park, Concordia, Cully, Eliot, Grant Park, Hollywood, Humboldt, Irvington, Kenton, King, Madison South, Overlook, Piedmont, Portsmouth, Rose City Park, Roseway, Sabin, St. Johns,
