 tures. His proposals evolve around sanctions and incentives, work toward a nuclear free zone in the Middle

East, restoration of diplomatic relations with Iran, and establishing more contact and exchanges between Iranians and Americans.
 Right now the space for those

constructive solutions might not yet exist sufficiently in the political and public life.

But will the political leaders—will we—be smart enough to under-

stand the trend and get on board when it comes to better understanding how to deconstruct enemy images, stereotypes and prejudice? And how do we move from polarized positions, to the interests of basic human needs such as security, participation, autonomy, rec-

ognition, and identity? Not only peace scientists understand that all humans share those needs.
