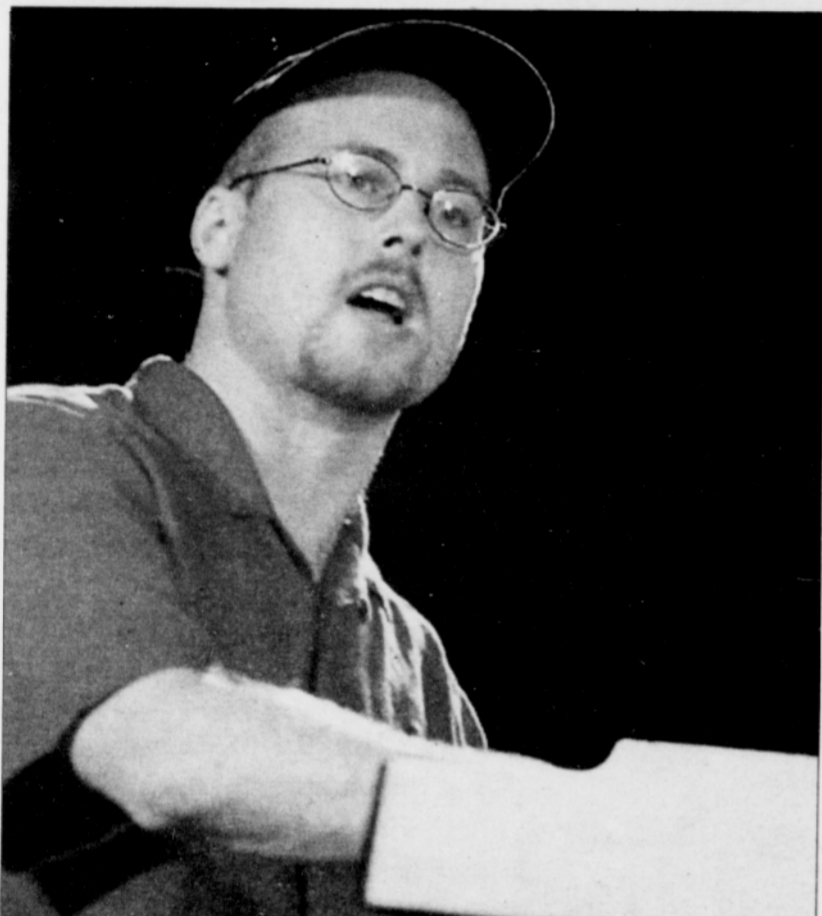

Colligan will be performing a special program entitled "Hands On! - A Tribute to Herbie Hancock and McCoy Tyner" in honor of the two jazz giants.

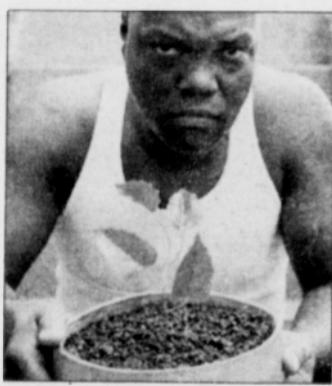

Colligan has long been active in jazz and music education. He served on the Juilliard faculty for two years and is currently an Assistant Professor at Portland State University.

### RACE: Are We So Different?

-- A new exhibit about the science of human variation at the

Oregon Museum of Science and Industry (OMSI) challenges visitors to consider race in a new light. Open through Jan. 1, the national exhibition tells the story of race from biological, cultural and historical points of view.



**Tsunami Artifacts on Display** -- Two pieces of the massive 201 ton dock that was washed away from a city on Japan's northeast coast by the devastating March 2011 tsunami and that landed on Oregon's Agate Beach this past June have now arrived at the Oregon Historical Society in Portland. The two metal boat tie offs are on display in the "Treasures of the Vault" exhibit through Dec. 30.

**The Mightiest Wind** -- The 50th anniversary of the most disastrous weather event to hit Oregon, the Columbus Day Storm is being commemorated with "The Mightiest Wind," a new exhibit that runs through Jan. 6 at the Oregon History Center, downtown.

The new Oregon Historical Society exhibit dives into a diverse range of subjects, from the displacement of minority populations from urban development, to cycles of boom and bust.
