POLICE BEAT

"Hipster Bandit" Caught

40-year-old Harvie Dale Oglesby III, who earned the nickname "hipster bandit," was arrested Friday after police said he robbed his fifth Portland bank.

Oglesby III is accused of using a demand note to obtain an undisclosed amount of money from the Consolidated Community Credit Union in the Kerns neighborhood. A tip lead police to catch up with him and take him into custody at Northeast 31st Avenue and Irving Street.

Witnesses told police Oglesby III had been seen riding a bicycle away from the area bank. Officers converged on the neighborhood near the bank and located him, police say.

The bank robberies spanned from July to November in southwest and northeast Portland.

The suspect is described as an unknown race male in his early to mid-20s, 6' tall, thin build, dark-colored jacket with a sports team logo and a hood up, wearing white gloves.

The victim was not hurt and no weapons were used, police say.

Plaid Pantry Robbery

Police arrested 39-year-old Joseph David Cashio in connection with an armed robbery on Dec. 4 at the Plaid Pantry, located at Northeast 60th Avenue and Halsey Street.

After using a replica firearm to rob the store, police say the suspect took off on foot into the surrounding neighborhood where officers later caught up to him.

Cashio was transported to the Detective Division and eventually booked into the Multnomah County Jail on a charge of Robbery in the Second Degree.

Bias Crimes Reward

Crime Stoppers is asking for help in solving two unsolved bias crimes that occurred in Portland in 2010 and 2011.

Just after midnight on Monday

Nov. 1, 2010, Timothy McCubbin, 49, was severely beaten and left unconscious under the pedestrian overpass at Southeast 16th Avenue and Brooklyn Street.



Detectives believe that the assault was likely due to victim's sexual orientation.

The suspect is described as a white male in his early to late 20s. He is approximately 6'1" with a muscular build. He had short blonde hair, a light beard, a light complexion, freckles and was riding a bike with another man on bike.

In what police to believe to be an unrelated incident, on Sunday May 22, 2011 at around 8:30p.m., 23-year-old Brad Forkner and 25-year-old Christopher Rosevear were attacked by several suspects after they were seen walking and holding hands in Waterfront Park.

The suspects are described as male, white, in their 20s and all about 5'11" inches tall, with short, dark hair. One was wearing a blue hooded sweatshirt, another was wearing a white or cream hooded sweatshirt and a third was wearing a brown hooded sweatshirt. The victim believes that the suspects were speaking in an Eastern European language.

Crime Stoppers is offering a reward of up to \$1,000 for information that leads to an arrest in this case.

Traffic Pursuit Arrests

Police arrested three people on drug and firearm charges after a traffic pursuit Thursday which started in at Southeast 12th Place and Powell and ended on Northeast Killingsworth Street.

The pursuit began after a report of a disturbance involving two men with guns. As officers arrived to the scene, the suspects sped away in a car. Police pursued the suspects northbound on the freeway until they were able to stop the car using spike strips to deflate the tires.

20-year-old Kevin Reinhard, 26-year-old Shawn Keele and 22-year-old Chelsea Scott were all arrested on charges of possession of methamphetamine. Keele and Reinhard were also charged with felony firearms violations.
