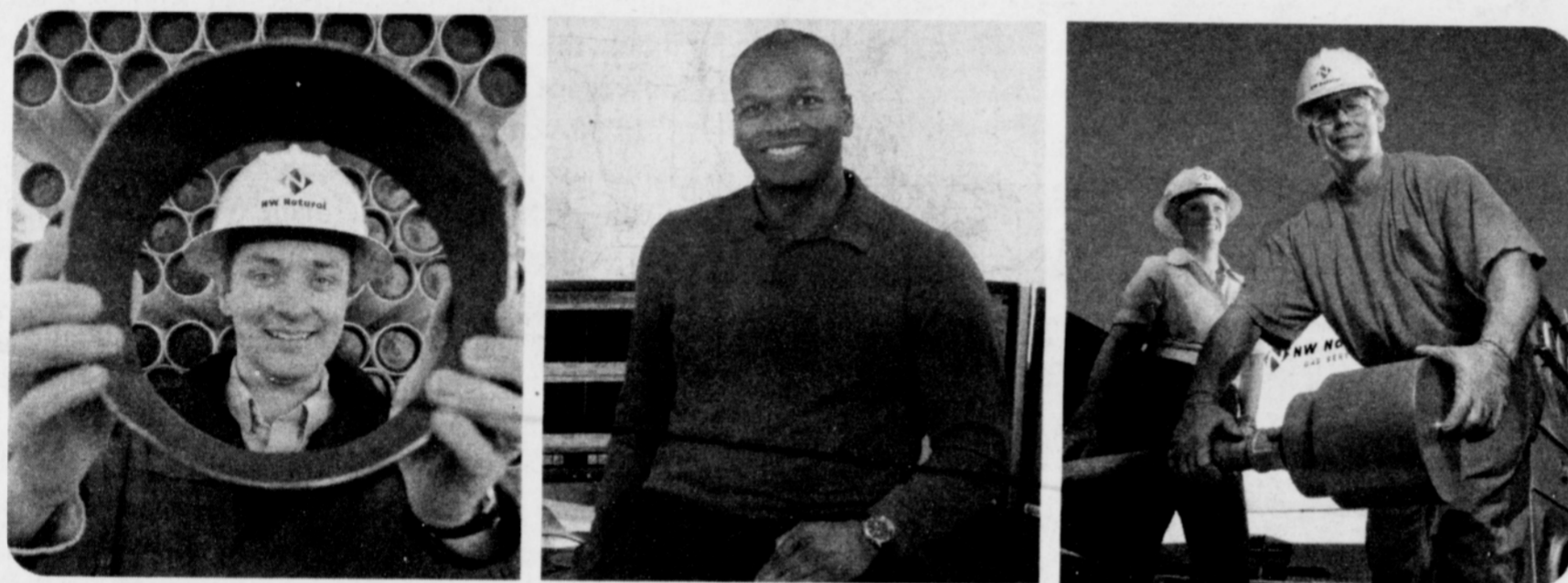
The University of Oregon Gospel Singers will perform several concerts during the week of the Martin Luther King Jr. holiday.

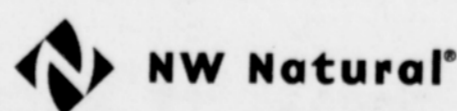

Two concerts scheduled for UO campus

The week of the Martin Luther King, Jr. holiday will see two exciting concerts sponsored by the University of Oregon School of Music and Dance, honoring the life and legacy of Dr. King.

The UO Gospel Singers, under the direction of ensemble conductor Andiel Brown, swept both the first and second annual Disney Gospel Choir Fest in 2010 and 2011. The free gospel concert scheduled for Monday, Jan. 21 will feature speakers and guest performers, not to mention the high-energy performance style for which the UO gospel program has become known.

The year 2013 marks the 20th anniversary of the University of Oregon's Dance Africa program, a Department of Dance repertory company. To commemorate Dance Africa's legacy of celebrating the diverse dances of Africa, company co-founder and director Rita Honka has planned an engaging winter concert scheduled for January 24 through 26. The celebration will feature guest artists, as well as the return of Dance Africa alumni.

The UO Gospel Singers Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Concert "Revival of A Dream" will take place on Monday, Jan. 21 at 3 p.m. at the Beall Concert Hall in the Frohnmayer Music Building. Admission is free.

You're invited to join the singers, guest performers and speakers for a powerful afternoon of song celebrating the ideas of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr.

The annual Dance Africa concerts will take place Thursday, Jan. 24 and Friday, Jan. 25 at 8 p.m.; and Saturday, Jan. 26 at 2 p.m. and 8 p.m. in Dougherty Dance Theatre, Gerlinger Annex. There is a \$10 general admission charge and \$5 for students.
