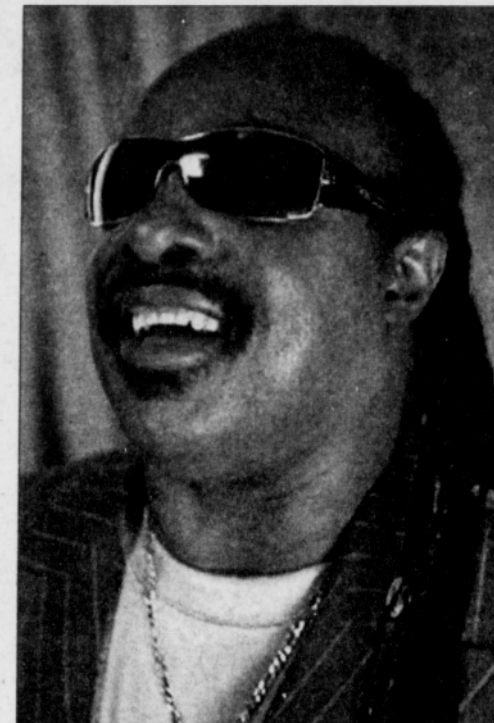

Legendary singer and songwriter Stevie Wonder will be in Portland on Friday, May 10 to celebrate his birthday and perform at the Quartet Restaurant, a new venue operated by black restaurateur Frank Taylor in the South Waterfront district at 1910 S. W. River Rd.

Net proceeds will benefit Project Clean Slate, the non-profit group that was organized by Roy Jay of the African American Chamber of Commerce to assist local people of color and others get a fresh start in employment, housing and other opportunities by getting a second chance to erase traffic tickets, minor criminal convictions and some civil court judgments.

The one night only event commands a \$500 per person ticket, which will include dinner overlooking the Willamette River and an exclusive performance by

Wonder.

Portland Marathon Reviews Security Procedures

The Portland Marathon will review its security procedures following the explosions that rocked the Boston Marathon Monday. Organizers said they will review and further improve existing protocols in advance of the Oct. 6 event.

Bombing Victims Honored

Gov. John Kitzhaber Tuesday ordered that flags at all public buildings be flown at half-staff through

Saturday in memory of the victims of the twin bombings Monday at the Boston Marathon. Portland Mayor Charlie Hales also issued a similar order. "Sorrow is everyone's first reaction to such a horrible event," Hales said.

Killed by Stray Bullet



A gun discharged inside a home and the bullet went through the house and accidentally struck and killed Shayla May Shonnecker, 9, who was playing outside. The boyfriend of the girl's mom, 32-year-old

Joseph Wolters, was practicing with the gun when it went off, police said.

U.S. Gun Violence Fears

Secretary of State John Kerry said in Tokyo Monday that fewer Japanese students are coming to the U.S. because their parents are afraid of gun violence. Kerry told CNN in an interview that American officials told him that Japanese parents think their kids just aren't safe in the United States.

Girl Safe; Mother Charged

Gresham Police found a missing 6-year-old girl safe and unharmed early Sunday morning nearly 12 hours after she was reported missing. Police said they arrested the girl's mother in connection with the disappearance after finding the pair hidden away in a Gresham hotel room.
