Justice Rallies on May Day

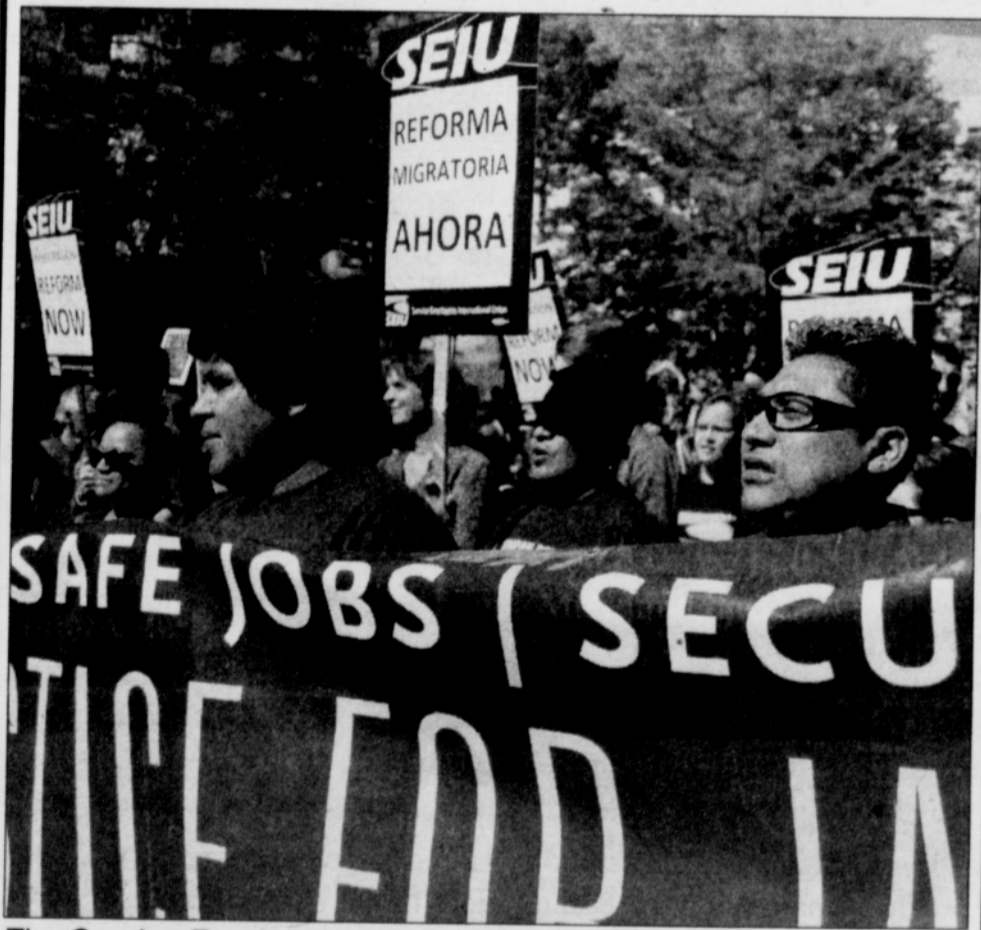
On Wednesday, May 1, the streets of downtown Portland boomed with voices and music as people came together in O'Bryant Square for the annual May Day demonstration.

A variety of banners and signs were held proudly and high, some reading: People Before Profit, No Human Is Illegal and Join an Orga-

nization Fighting for Justice.

May Day is the international day of the worker, birthed of an 1886 Chicago protest for 8-hour work days that turned riot.

In Portland, hundreds of people with numerous causes gathered at the relatively small downtown park, but unlike its namesake, this brief protest proceeded without incident.

According to the Healthy Kids Healthy Portland campaign, which advocates fluoridating the city's water, more than 80 local organiza-

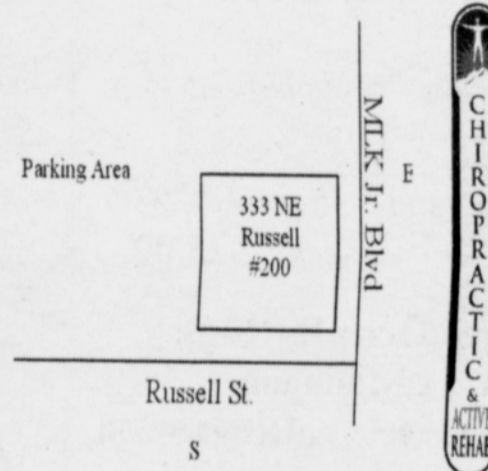
