### Club Shooting Arrest

A man was arrested for attempted murder after shots were exchanged between people in the area of Diamonds Gentlemen's Club at 3390 N.E. Sandy Blvd. It happened Sunday around 2:40 a.m. Police say the gunfire appears to be gang-related.

### TriMet Fined by Judge

A federal judge has fined TriMet, saying the agency isn't playing ball with a lawsuit filed against it. The case surrounds an April 23, 2010 incident in Old Town where a bus driver made an illegal left turn and killed two people.

### Gas Prices on Rise

As motorists head into the Memorial Day weekend, the average price of a gallon of regular unleaded in the Portland area has jumped a nickel in the past week, hitting \$3.98 on Tuesday morning. Tight supplies and refinery issues in California and Washington were blamed.



### Morehouse Commencement

for a shelter and increase the number of clients becoming self sufficient.

"We'll be able to provide more services to people who are not staying in the dorm," Kidd said. "Before we only had two offices that six case managers and two interns shared, and now everybody will have an office. So there will be more access and availability for advocacy and working with clients to meet their needs."

Service priorities are helping with

for employment, mental health services, or addiction treatment, "Whatever it is they need to improve their life," she said.

Though the new space affords clients and staff alike more opportunities, it remains unfinished. The top two floors of the four floor building feature 42 single-occupancy rooms that the Salvation Army hopes to convert into permanent living spaces for homeless women.

But it is estimated it will take another \$300,000 in donations to fully refurbish the rooms.

"Being able to permanently house people is really important. It'd be a blessing," Kidd said.
