

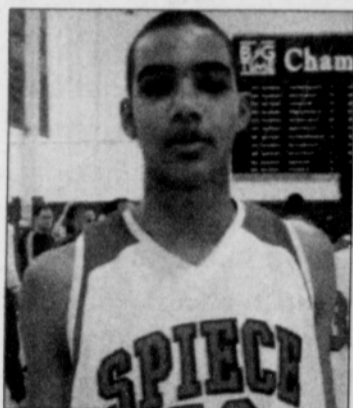

Rose City Showcase Brings Top Recruits

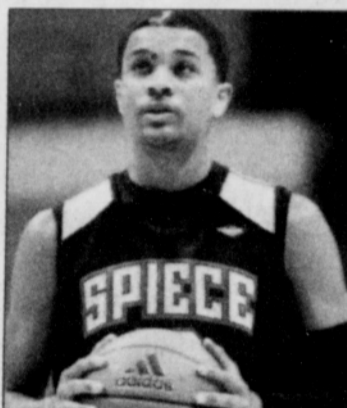
Tournament gets ready for June 7 tip off

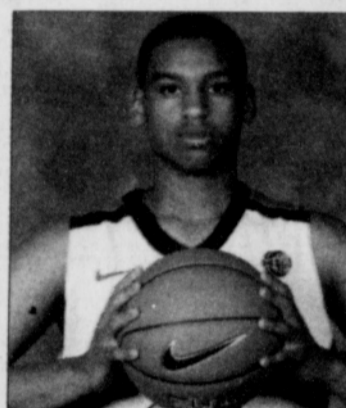
Before Dwight Howard became an NBA All-Star, before Josh Smith and Gerald Green won the NBA Slam Dunk



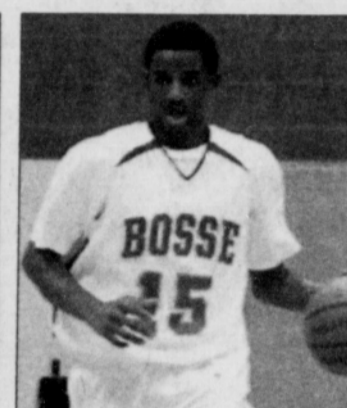

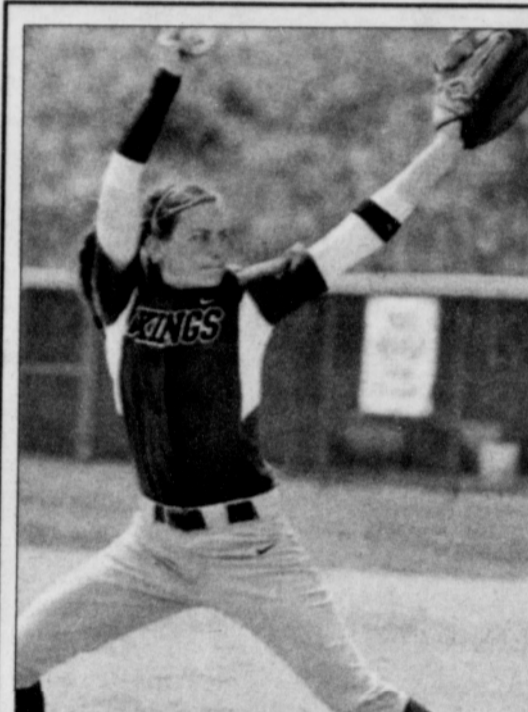
