

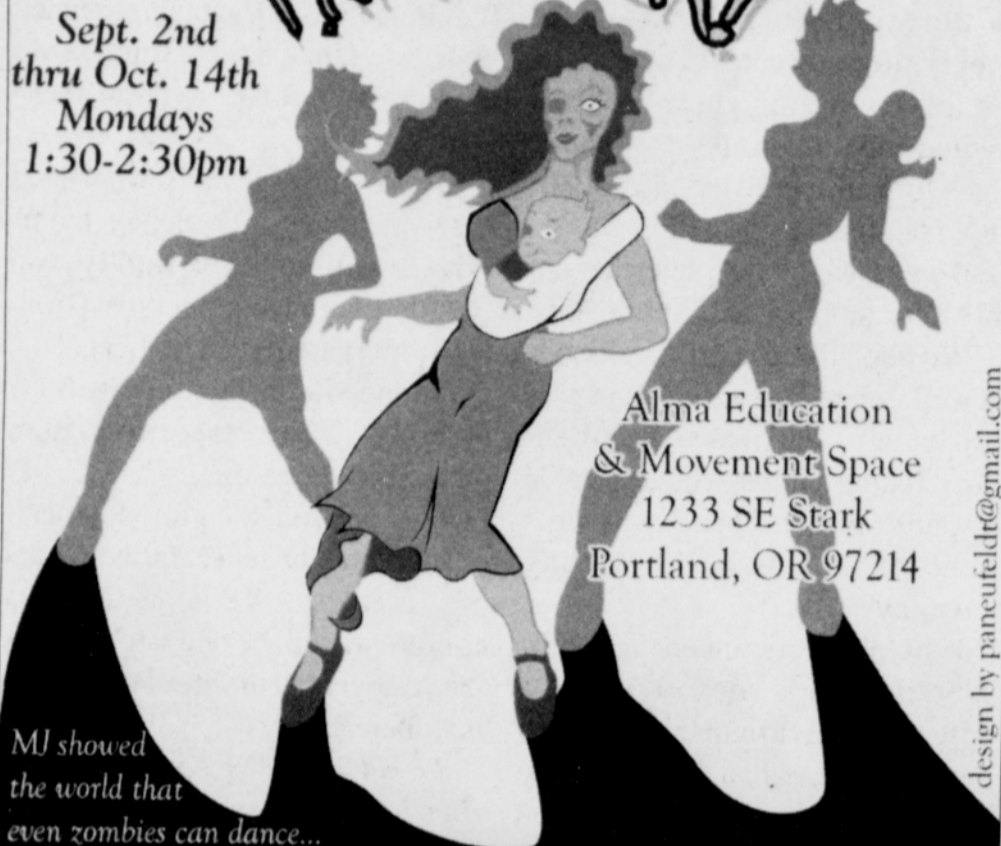

## Parade Dedication

Leslie Mundt will be honored as Grand Marshal of Beaverton's Celebration Parade for her more than 20 years of dedication and service as the parade's parade coordinator.

Mundt began her involvement with the parade in 1986 as a sports coordinator for Tualatin Hills Park and Recreation District. She retired in February.

"I really enjoyed putting the parade together from the beginning and seeing the hard work come together as the parade goes down the street," said Mundt. "It is such a thrill to see everyone so excited--from the entries to the spectators."

This year's 56th annual parade begins at 10 a.m. on Saturday, Sept. 7 and includes family-friendly activities and entertainment on the Beaverton

City Library, 12375 S.W. Fifth St. and on the lawn across from City Park. The third annual Beaverton 5K Fun Run/Walk begins the same day at 9 a.m. in Griffith Park.

Beaverton's Celebration Parade has grown into a community tradition.

Area high school marching bands, colorful floats, and civic and cultural organizations will be cheered on by spectators as they make their way through the streets.

The parade route begins at Beaverton Christian Church at the corner of Southwest Wilson Avenue and Allen Boulevard. It then takes Erickson Avenue to Fifth Street, passing by the Beaverton City Library. The parade ends at Griffith Park near Beaverton City Hall.
