**Young, Black & Gifted**  
Recognizing kids on right track

The Portland Observer's Portland's African American youth are often caught up in a web of negative public perceptions brought by news of gang violence, the urban achievement gap and school drop-out rates.

But now a group of young Black kids in Portland are on the right path, making good grades, heading to college and are making positive contributions to the city. A new photographic series recognizes the hard work of some of these students and shows that there is still reason to be optimistic.

"Young, Black & Gifted," a photo series getting the spotlight on the accomplishments of high-achieving African American students, opens to the public on Monday, April 8 at Portland School District headquarters at 501 N. Dixon St. and will later be moved to the Lloyd Center Mall.

The project is the brain child of Reba Williams, the owner's health and community engagement manager, who said she got the idea after having a conversation with someone who seemed shocked when she mentioned an African American student had been accepted. After the conversation she worried that all the attention on the problems of young Black students was drawing out the best and brightest others.

"I've been struck about deficits and achievement gaps," she said.

Williams said the exhibit came together with a call to photographers of Black students doing well, artists and the recruitment of a photographer and web developer.

Michelle A. Freeman at Jefferson High School is one of the 13 students featured in the exhibit.

Her path: A 10th grader, she does especially well in English classes, taught by Anne Trivette, one of her favorite teachers, and chemistry is getting steadily easier. Her plans to go to college and rethinking about law school down the road.

"It's exciting to be a part of this," she said of her high school. "I had
