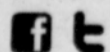

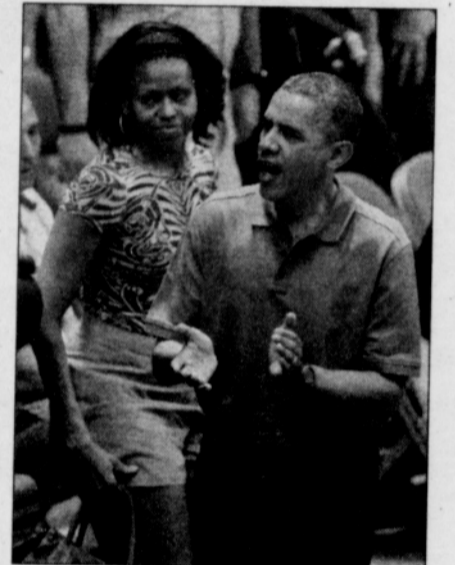
Disabled Parking Reform
