

the theme of this year's celebration as a way to appreciate the sacrifices that have been made to live in a democratic society.

The event will also honor the 50th anniversary of King's "I Have a Dream" speech on Aug. 28, 1963 during the March on Washington.

World Arts produces one of the largest MLK observances, utilizing the arts in a way that amplifies the importance of educating all of America's youth about the Civil Rights movement and the people who made it happen.

This year's program will include an array of community speakers from various civic and social community organizations. The format will include digital media and high definition broadcasts by civil rights era performers.
