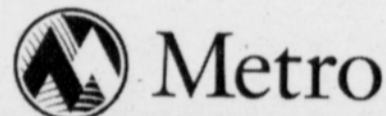

## Peninsula League Future Discussed

A special meeting has been called by the Peninsula Little League President, John McCann, to discuss current organization and membership requirements, this coming after two recent reform proposals were presented to the organization. One proposes re-districting the league to encompass what is now Peninsula, absorbing all its current players, coaches, and parents into the new boundaries. The second is to merge Peninsula with an adjacent or adjoining league.

As of now all players currently in Peninsula will remain in a newly constituted league or leagues close to their homes.

All members are invited and encouraged to attend. For our purposes, a "member" is defined as an adult. Also, a Member is any player residing within the League's boundaries or attending school full time within them.

The meeting will be held at Holy Redeemer Church in Clare Hall, located at 127 NE Rosa Parks Way on Thursday Jan. 16 from 6 to 7 pm.

## Seahawks Advance to NFC Championship

The top-seeded Seahawks advanced to the NFC championship game for the second time in franchise history and will host San Francisco. Seattle last reached the conference title game in the 2005 playoffs.

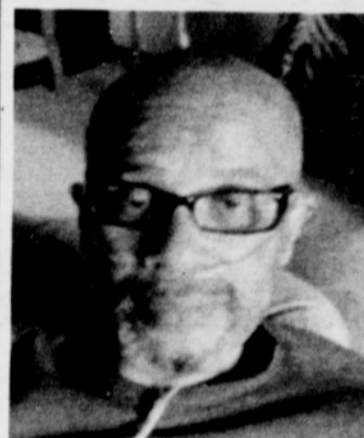
Marshawn Lynch was key in Seattle's overpowering win against the New Orleans Saints Saturday to advance in the postseason — again.

Lynch ran for 140 yards and two touchdowns; Steven Hauschka kicked three field goals in blustery conditions; and Seattle's defense flustered Drew Brees for a 23-15 victory in the NFC divisional playoff game.

New Orleans could never overcome a fumble in the first half that led to Lynch's first touchdown run and a 13-0 lead, and a pair of missed field goals by Shayne Graham. Both times Graham was wide left kicking into the wind after not missing after he was resigned by the Saints late in the season.

I am coming to you today on behalf of my brother, Mark Brock. He suffers from Chronic Obstructive Pulmonary Disease (COPD).
