

Civil Rights Activist Will Speak



Angela Davis

Since the 1960s, Angela Davis has gained notoriety for her civil rights activism becoming a renowned public figure in the process; Thursday she will be making a Black History Month visit at the liberal arts and sciences college Pacific University.

Davis came to national attention after being removed from her teaching position in the Philosophy Department at UCLA as a result of her social activism and her membership in the Com-

munist Party, USA.

She currently is a retired professor with the History of Consciousness Department at the University of California, Santa Cruz, and is the former director of the university's Feminist Studies Department. For the past several decades her work

has been largely in the area of prison reform.

Her lecture is scheduled at 7:30 p.m. in the Stoller Center at Pacific's Forest Grove campus and is sponsored by the school's Center for Peace and Spirituality, the Tom McCall Center for Policy Innovation, the Center for Civic Engagement, the Office of Diversity, the Office for Student Academic Inclusion and Success, and Student Activity funds. Tickets are sold out.

The Portland discussion group Race Talks 2 will be facilitating another event at Kennedy School, this time discussing the links between school push-outs and the death penalty.

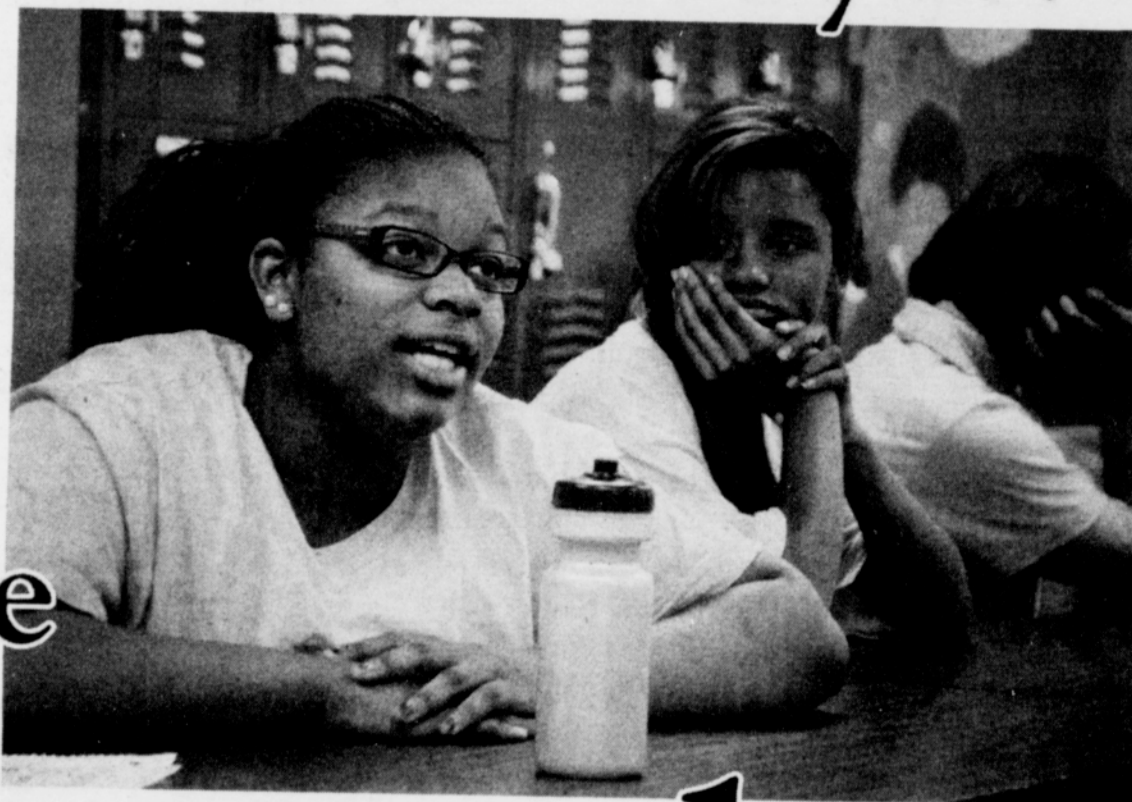
