and son Alfred Wincher Jr.; 12 grandchildren, 13 great grandchildren, and a host of nieces, nephews and cousins.

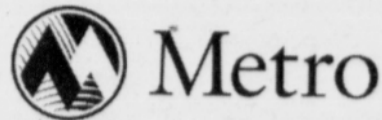

CITY OF RIDGEFIELD N. 5th AVENUE IMPROVEMENT PROJECT (MILL STREET TO DIVISION STREET) ENGINEERS ESTIMATE \$188,100

Bid Date: 2:00 p.m. local time on Thursday, February 20, 2014

Sealed proposals will be received by the undersigned at the City of Ridgefield City Hall, 230 Pioneer Street, P.O. Box 608, Ridgefield, Washington 98642-0608, until the bid closing at 2:00 p.m. local time on Thursday, February 20, 2014, for furnishing the necessary labor, materials, equipment, tools, and guarantees thereof to construct the N. 5th Avenue Improvement Project. No bid will be received after the bid closing time. All sealed bids must be marked "SEALED BID - DO NOT OPEN."

Project Description:

The work will include widening and reconstruction of N. 5th Avenue between Mill Street and Division Street. The project will include, but is not limited to, excavation/embankment, street widening, curb and gutter, sidewalks, ADA ramps, signing and striping, driveway and private property improvements, storm drainage, landscaping, and other miscellaneous items shown and described in the Contract Provisions and Contract Plans.

The work required for substantial completion shall be completed within thirty (30) working days after the commencement date stated in the Notice to Proceed. All bidding and construction is to be performed in compliance with the request for Proposal, Plans, Specifications, and Contract for this project and any addenda issued thereto which are on file at the office of the City Clerk, City Hall, City of Ridgefield, Washington.

At the time and date stated above, the proposals will be publicly opened and read aloud. Proposals are to be submitted only on the form provided with the Specifications. All proposals must be accompanied by a certified check, cashier's check, money order, or bid bond payable to the "City of Ridgefield" of value not less than five percent (5%) of the total amount bid.

The project is financed through the Community Development Block Grant Program with funds obtained from the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, and the City of Ridgefield, Washington. The contract will be subject to regulations of the Department of Labor and Housing and Urban Development.

Attention is called to Federal provisions for Equal Employment Opportunity, HUD Section 3 requirements, and the minimum wages as set forth in the contract documents. The City of Ridgefield expressly reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive minor irregularities or informalities and to further make award of the Project to the lowest responsive, responsible bidder as it best serves the interest of the City.
