

Opening Doors to Native Art

Concordia University, Red Lodge Transition Services, and the Art of Reconciliation is hosting special "School Day" events for elementary-age children to view an exhibition of Native American art featuring local and internationally acclaimed artists.

Activities, including Native American music and dance; demonstrations for making bead jewelry, cedar roses, and hand drums; Native American story-telling; and over 100 ex-

amples of Native American art and artifacts, will take place at the north-east Portland college's George R. White Library and Learning Center. Free and open to the public, the exhibition will last until April 5 and can be viewed during normal library hours. The program is part of Concordia University Libraries' Art & Culture program which is dedicated to educating and inspiring the college's students, faculty and the greater Portland community.
