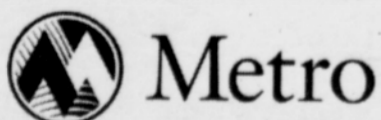

Sealed bids will be received by the City of Camas, Office of the Finance Department, 616 NE 4th Avenue, Camas, Washington 98607 until 10:30 A.M., on Tuesday, April 15, 2014, and will then and there be publicly read for the construction of the improvement.

All bid proposals shall be accompanied by a bid proposal deposit in cash, certified check, cashier's check, or surety bond in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the amount of such bid proposal. Should the successful bidder fail to enter into such contract and furnish satisfactory performance bond within the time stated in the Washington State Department of Transportation (WSDOT) 2014 Standard Specifications for Road, Bridge, and Municipal Construction (standard specifications), the bid proposal deposit shall be forfeited to the City of Camas.

Plans and specifications may be picked up at the Camas Municipal Center, Community Development/ Public Works Department, located at 616 NE 4th Avenue, Camas, Washington 98607. Plans and Specifications will be available for pickup after 9:00 A.M. on Tuesday, March 25, 2014. The cost for Plans and specifications is \$35.00 plus 8.4% Sales Tax. The improvement for which bids will be received follows:

Bid opening on Tuesday, April 15, 2014, at 10:30 A.M. at the Camas Municipal Building located at 616 NE 4th Avenue, Camas, Washington 98607. Sealed bids will be received by the City of Camas Office of the Finance Department, 616 NE 4th Avenue, Camas, Washington 98607 until 10:30 A.M. Registration as a planholder with the City of Camas is required to obtain Contract Addenda.

Statement of Work:

This Contract provides for the improvement of,

The City's water system by installing a new 16-inch ductile iron water main across BNSF property from the end of SE Garfield Street in Camas, Washington connecting to the City's existing 16-inch steel water line in SE 6th Avenue, on the west side of the Washougal River. This work also includes installation of a 48-inch steel casing pipe under the BNSF railroad tracks by pipe ramming for installing the 16-inch water main under the tracks. Work also includes connecting an existing 6-inch water main to the new 16-inch water main.

The City's sewer system by installation of a 24-inch sewer force main under the BNSF railroad tracks north of the intersection of SE 6th Avenue and SE Polk Street in a 48-inch steel casing that will be installed under the tracks by pipe ramming, and other related items in accordance with the attached Contract Plans and Contract Provisions, and the Standard Specifications.

The Contract is subject to all applicable Federal, State and local laws, ordinances, codes, orders, regulations, policies, and permits of the State of Washington, to

include the Departments of Commerce and Labor and Industries, and the Washington State Public Works Board. All work performed on the project will be subject to the State of Washington Minimum Hourly Prevailing Wage Rates.

Disadvantaged Business Participation: The City of Camas encourages the solicitation and recruitment, to the extent possible, of certified minority-owned (MBE), women-owned (WBE), and emerging small (ESB) businesses, in the construction of this project.
