# The Week in Review

## Boston Marathon Tribute

U.S. Vice President Joe Biden, other leaders and survivors of the Boston Marathon bombing shared messages of thanks and defiance on Tuesday at a tribute to the three people killed and 264 wounded in the attack exactly one year ago.

## Community Center Shooting

A white supremacist, identified as F. Glenn Miller, 73, was charged with first-degree murder after three people were shot and killed at a Jewish Community Center in a suburb of Kansas City, Mo on Sunday. Despite his history of directing hate speech against Jews, the three people killed were Christian—one a Catholic, and two others Methodist.

#### Mom Admits Killing Children

Authorities say a Utah woman accused of killing six babies that she gave birth to over 10 years told investigators that she either strangled or suffocated the children and then put them inside boxes in her garage.

# Zoo Elephant Protest



## **Hip Hop Concert Evacuated**

1,200 to 1,500 concert-goers were evacuated from a SchoolBoy Q show at the Crystal Ballroom on Sunday when it looked like a support beam was damaged. On Monday, the venue was inspected and repairs ordered.

#### **New Street Fee Considered**

A telephone survey by DHM Research of Portland, released to the public last week, shows around half of the 800 respondents contacted were in support of a \$12 to \$15 monthly street maintenance and safety fee for Portland streets. City leaders are considering new sources of income for future expenses.

### **Phelps Ends Retirement**

The most decorated Olympian of all-time, Michael Phelps, announced Monday 14 that he would come out of retirement for a meet later this month in Mesa, Ariz. Phelps, 28, has 22 Olympic medals and this will be the first competition since the 2012 London Games.

# TriMet's proposed budget

TriMet's proposed 2014/2015 budget calls for more frequent service, better schedule reliability and less overcrowding. Here are some highlights:

- More Frequent Service: We plan to add weekday evening trips on Frequent Service bus lines and MAX to get back to 15-minute (or better) frequency throughout the day.
- · Better schedule reliability: Schedules will change on Lines 20, 71 and 72 to improve reliability.
- Less crowding: We're adding buses to Lines 4, 8, 9, 10, 15, 20, 33, 44, 76, 94 and 99 to relieve
  overcrowding.
- More new buses: 64 new buses will join the fleet this year, for a total of 249 buses replaced since 2012.
- No fare increase: Once again this year, riders will not see a fare increase.
