The cause is dear to the hearts of

members of the company of La Familia Gang Music, sponsors of the event. Swiggle Mandela (Bo-Mandela Cordeta), and younger brother Timmi Hendrix (Timothy-John Cordeta), are both half Filipino. Many of their family members were fortunate to have survived the disaster, including their grand-

mother whose home, along with her neighborhood, were submerged in 15 feet of sea water. She and her family, and many other survivors were forced to relocate to other cities as refugees.

The Haiyan Unity Benefit Show will have an all-star lineup of local Portland musicians. Featured per-

formers include Anael Jeannis and Bel Mizik, a 7 member super band, and well known local rap musicians Talilo and Taryn, who are also of Filipino decent.

This will be a very diverse and fun event for the whole family to enjoy. Doors open at 7 p.m. and will be for all ages until 10 p.m.

Every contribution will provide many breaths of fresh air, clean water, and supplies for the Haiyan survivors and volunteers of the Philippines.
