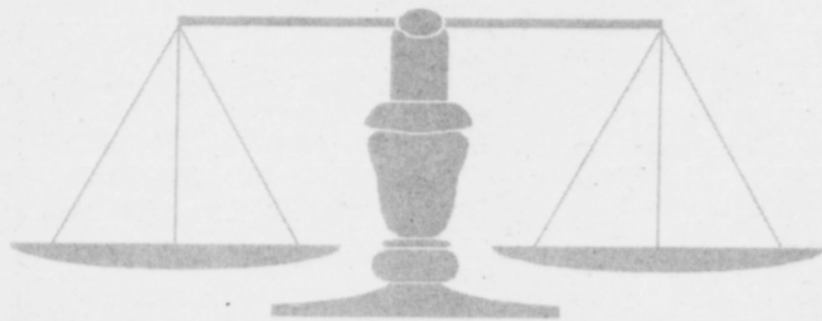

Sealed bids will be received by the City of Camas, Office of the Finance Department, 616 NE 4th Avenue, Camas, Washington, 98607 until **10:30 A.M. Tuesday, May 13, 2014** and will then and there be publicly read for the construction of the improvement.

All bid proposals shall be accompanied by a bid proposal deposit in cash, certified check, cashier's check, or surety bond in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the amount of such bid proposal. Should the successful bidder fail to enter into such contract and furnish satisfactory performance bond within the time stated in the 2014 WSDOT Standard Specifications, the bid proposal deposit shall be forfeited to the City of Camas.

Bid packages may be picked up in the Camas City Hall, Community Development Department located at 616 NE 4th Avenue, Camas, Washington **after 10:00 a.m. on Wednesday, April 23, 2014**. Plans and Specifications may be purchased for \$105.00 (\$113.82 including tax) both of which are non-refundable. Registration as a planholder is required to obtain Contract Addenda.

This contract provides for the improvement of NW 38th Avenue by reconstructing 2,800 LF of existing roadway on NW 38th Avenue, this work includes clearing and grubbing, roadway excavation, stormwater conveyance system, paving, bidder design-build irrigation system, erosion control, curb/gutter and sidewalk, traffic control, permanent pavement marking, illumination system, traffic signal modifications, landscaping, wetland mitigation work, construction of two stormwater facilities, and other related items in accordance with the attached Contract Plans and Contract Provisions, and the Standard Specifications.

• All work, except for the planting work in Bid Item A65 "Wetland Mitigation", shall be physically complete within **130 working days** after the commencement date stated in the Notice to Proceed.

• The plantings included in Bid Item A65 - "Wetland Mitigation" shall begin no earlier than October 1, 2014 and shall be completed no later than April 1, 2015. Plants shall be installed

when site conditions are the wettest and the plants are dormant.

All bidding and construction is to be performed in compliance with the Contract Provisions and Contract Plans for this project and any addenda issued thereto that are on file at the office of the City Clerk, Camas City Hall, Camas, Washington.

Financing of the Project has been provided in part by a grant from the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). All FHWA requirements or provisions must be met by the General Contractor and all Subcontractors. All work performed on the project will be subject to the higher of the State or Federal Prevailing Wage Rates.
