Smith says she supported the opening of a health center and a courthouse facility in east county to provide the "necessary services" for the area.

Her advocacy of a county Summerworks program, operated through Worksystems in conjunction with the city of Portland, is an example of boosting economic opportunities and jobs for low income people of working age, she says. In its second year now, the effort successfully put 175 young people to work last summer.

When it came to one of the more controversial developments in her district, a Portland Development Commission project that was to bring a Trader Joes specialty grocery to the corner of Northeast Martin Luther King Boulevard and Alberta Street, Smith chose to not speak on the issue publicly for a spell.

"To me, it wasn't about not interjecting, I didn't have a role," she says. "The mayor's office and the city they were taking the lead on it, so I know how to stay in my lane. I mean, I don't tell the mayor how to run PDC and he doesn't tell us how to run our health clinics. So I stayed in my lane."

Smith says she is very supportive of any business, whether it be Trader Joes or anyone else, locating in northeast Portland.

"The key is hiring people from the community, not only to build the developments, but also hire people upon completion," she said.

If none of the four candidates gets more than 50 percent of the votes, the top two opponents will in a November runoff.

pearance started out as a missing person case, after one of the women who traveled to Hawaii with her reported her missing.

Harris' family said they were grateful to investigators and prosecutors for bringing Cosby to justice.

"We are the voices for the voiceless and are eternally grateful to the Marines, NCIS and Hawaii law enforcement for bringing Ivanice's murderer to justice," Harris' family wrote in a statement. "We've had peace throughout this process knowing that somebody had our baby's back. Ivanice was a gift to the world and is survived by a very close-knit, loving family who will continue to live on because that is what she would have wanted."
