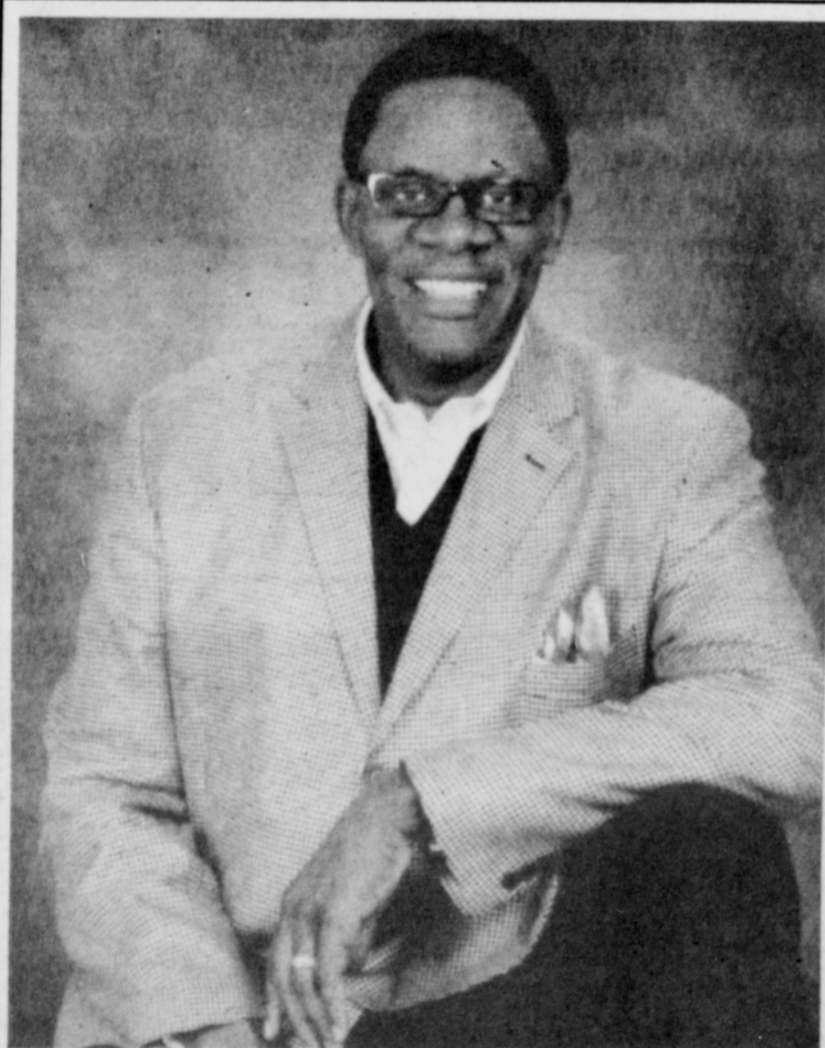


Career Training Instructor Pharmacy Technician
