America after Ferguson

Town hall to explore social issues raised

Gwen Ifill, the co-anchor and managing editor of PBS Newshour, and moderator and managing editor of Washington Week, will moderate "America after Ferguson," a town hall meeting that will explore the many issues that have been brought into public discourse in the wake of Michael Brown's death in Ferguson, Mo. The unarmed black teenager was shot by a white Ferguson police officer on Aug. 9.

The program will air Friday, Sept. 26 at 8 p.m. It was produced by WGBH Boston in partnership with the Nine Network/KETC in St. Louis and WETA in Washington, D.C.

While the facts of the case are still in dispute, for many the story of Ferguson has become a symbol of the larger social divides in America, exposing a persistent disconnect along lines of race, class and identity.

Through conversations and special reports, "America after

Ferguson" will explore these complex questions raised by the events in Ferguson.

"The upheaval in Ferguson stirred up an all too familiar stew of debate over race, justice and citizenship," Ifill said. "It's a discussion fueled by community outrage and resentment on all sides, but it is one that shouldn't end. Our town hall conversation will shed light rather than heat on the topic, as we seek out the voices interested in digging deeper."

Rosa Parks Papers Shared

The Library of Congress will be the new home of the Rosa Parks Collection thanks to a 10-year loan of the archives from the Howard G. Buffett Foundation.

The collection comprises approximately 1,500 items including personal correspondence and photographs, autobiographical notes, letters from presidents, her Presidential Medal of Freedom and Congressional Gold Medal, additional honors and awards, clothing and furniture, and 200 drawings by schoolchildren and hundreds of greeting cards from individuals thanking her for her inspirational role in the civil rights movement.

Items from the collection will be incorporated into the new exhibition "The Civil Rights Act of 1964: A Long Struggle for Freedom," which opened this month in Washington, D.C. In addition, the library will digitize the documents and visual materials and make them widely available through its website.

"Rosa Parks is an iconic figure in the American civil rights movement, the very definition of the quiet power of an individual to inspire action in others," said James H. Billington, librarian of Congress. "This collection joins our unparalleled holdings of African-American materials in a public institution."

Maximum Connections is the theme for a job and career fair being held at the World Forestry Center on Thursday, Sept. 25 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.

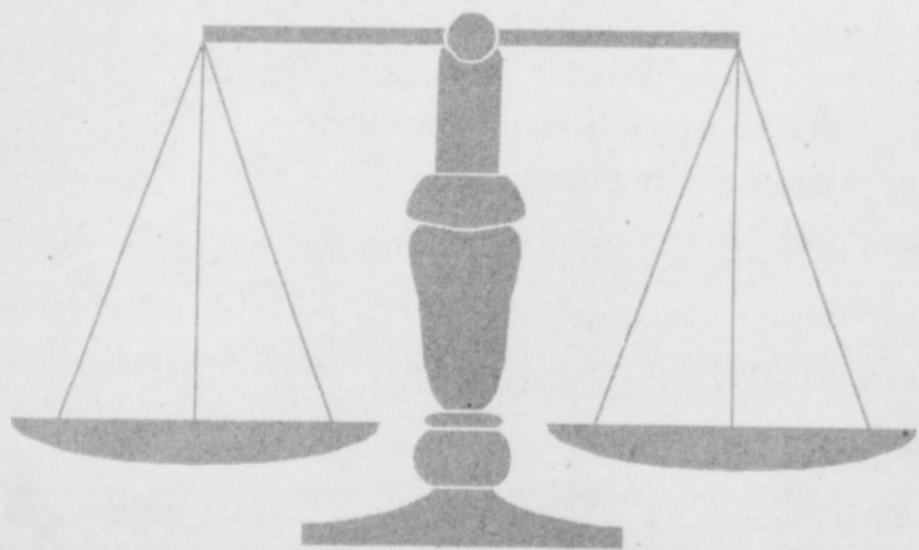
