nity-wide effort to provide every Portland Public high school with new synthetic turf fields and tracks. The Ten Great Fields endeavor, also known as the "Places for Sport" project, began more than 10 years ago with a vision to ensure students and neighborhoods all across the city would have a safe and quality field and track to use all year around. It is a partnership between PPS, NIKE, the City of Portland, parents and community members.

Since the inception of The 10 Great Fields project, NIKE and its executives and employees have contributed approximately \$2 million to the project. In addition, NIKE is supporting the dedication with t-shirts, signage and festive activities for the Jefferson High School community.

"Ten years ago, representatives from Nike, PPS, school communities, and city leaders teamed up and committed to an ambitious game plan: To build 10 beautiful new fields for all of Portland Public High Schools. It was first down and 10 fields to go," said Julia Brim-Edwards, Sr. Director, Global Government and Public Affairs at NIKE. "With the dedication of the Jefferson High School field, we have completed nine of these fields. We have just one to go. Now more than 48,000 PPS students throughout the district have access to a high quality field

to play and compete on." Brim-Edwards who served on the PPS school board from 2000 to 2004 has been a leader in the project since its inception.

Since 2002, Portland Public Schools, along with Lincoln, Cleveland, Roosevelt, Benson (Buckman Field), Madison, Grant, Wilson and now Jefferson high school communities have diligently raised money to install new fields. Other schools receiving new fields and/or tracks this fall are Wilson, Madison and Marshall (to be used by Franklin during the bond rebuild of its school). Franklin High School's new track and field, the tenth of the Ten Great Fields project, will be completed in 2017, as part of the voter approved 2012 school improvement bond.

Jefferson Principal, Margaret Calvert said, "I am so pleased for Jefferson students to have this beautiful new field and track. For years, students have had to run track and play football and soccer at other schools because our field would get so torn up once it started to rain. When I walk outside onto our front steps and see the brand new Jefferson Democrats blue track framing the brilliant green field, I feel as excited as our kids."

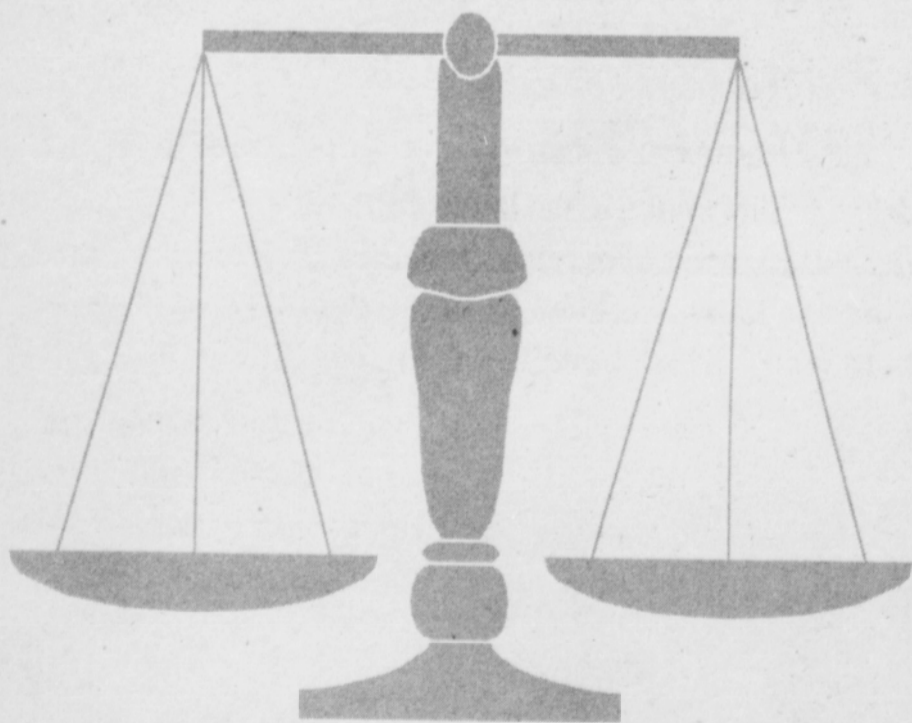
Carole Smith, Superintendent for Portland Public Schools, said, "It was a marathon and not a sprint, but we are now at the finish line. I couldn't be more excited for all of the kids present and future, who get to use

this beautiful new Jefferson track and field. We are so grateful to our partners at NIKE, Multnomah County Commissioner Loretta Smith, and the Portland Timbers Army 107th Independent Supporters Trust for their support. I am so proud that PPS has been able to renovate nine out of ten high school fields and to know that our tenth field will be started next year. This is a long-awaited dream come true for our students and community members, to have an athletic facility they can be proud of and where they will forge friendships, learn teamwork and good sportsmanship, and continue to develop the love of exercise and sports."

PPS has invested \$7.2 million through The 10 Great Fields fund and the Construction Excise Tax revenues earmarked for capital projects. Other community members provided additional support to the fields, including Portland Parks and Recreation (\$100,000), Northeast United Soccer Club (\$50,000), Southeast Soccer Club (\$50,000), Foothills Soccer Club (\$50,000), Portland Timbers Army 107th Independent Supporters Trust (\$50,000), Oregon Sports Authority Foundation, and The Robert D. and Marcia H. Randall Family.

The upcoming completion of the fields comes at a time that the PPS is reuniting its athletic league – the Portland Interscholastic League – into a single 6A League for the first time in eight years.
