Hours of work may include evening or weekend teaching assignments. Initial assignment will be at the Cascade Campus. The Week in Review

Woman Throws Boy off Bridge

A woman is charged with murder for throwing her 6-year-old boy off the Yaquina Bay Bridge in Newport. 34-year-old Jillian McCabe called 911 at 6:25 p.m. Monday to report what she did. She later told police that she heard voices in her head telling her to throw the boy off the bridge. About 4 hours later, the boy's body was located east of the bridge.

Patient Negative for Ebola

A woman from West Africa being monitored for Ebola at Providence Milwaukie Hospital has tested negative for the infectious disease. "Based on test results and an evaluation of her clinical condition, I'm pleased to say there are no cases of Ebola in Oregon," Tri-County Health Officer Dr. Paul Lewis said Monday.

Deadly Halloween Wreck

A 7-year-old girl died, her mother was hurt, and another child and another adult were critically injured when they were struck by a car Friday, Halloween night, while trick-or-treating in Vancouver. Police said Duane Abbott, 47, of

Vancouver, was impaired behind the wheel and drove his car over the curb and slammed into the group of people.

Boys Hit on Sidewalk

Two boys walking on a Gresham sidewalk were struck by a car Friday afternoon just after they got off a school bus near the 900 block of Northeast Country Club Avenue. The 10-year-old boy died over the weekend, while the 8-year-old remained in the hospital, police said. Officials said the crash began as a two-vehicle collision, and that one of the cars involved careened onto the sidewalk.

Nordstrom Job Losses

More than 300 employees will be impacted as Nordstrom closes its Lloyd Center and Westfield Vancouver stores Jan. 10. The department store chain announced in February it was closing the two stores because they were underperforming relative to other Nordstrom locations. A store spokeswoman Monday said the store closures will affect 142 employees at the Vancouver store and 172 workers at Lloyd Center.

began working in the school's work study office. From the campus job until now, Edwards has never taken a job outside the field of higher education. She went on to work at Skidmore and Orange County Community College in Middletown, N. Y., among other colleges.

In terms of the type of success she'd like to see at PCC, Edwards emphasized her interest in removing barriers to education for students. That includes making sure there is ample childcare available, that financial aid is readily avail-

able, that organizations for women and people of color remain active and well-funded.

Edwards also spoke of the PCC Cascade Campus's plans for a Multicultural Center which is coming to the north Portland campus as part of a new Student Union Building that's scheduled to open in January. She is eager to have such a facility become the go-to place for multi cultural attractions and programming.

Edwards spoke not only of lifting cultural and economic barriers but of also integrating the community and neighborhood as well.

Since coming to Portland, Edwards has joined the board at the Portland Community Reinvestment Initiatives, an organization that helps low-income Portland families and individuals find affordable housing and stability. She's also on the advisory board for the Oregon Association of Minority Entrepreneurs.

Edwards activity in the community is matched by her interest in the school and even the details of the new construction on campus.

"We don't build fences or gates here," Edwards said.

The campus's goal is to be open and inviting, to draw in the local community and show others that an education can be functional and be accessible to everyone.
