

## Strip Club Death Nets 15 Years

A 32-year-old Portland man has been sentenced to 15 years in prison for using a gun to kill another man in a fight outside a northeast Portland strip club.

Bradley Carl O'Rourke was seen leaving Club Skinn in the early hours of the morning of May 8, 2013. Police investigators said he walked past a group of five people and cat-called a 21-year-old woman in the group. A scuffle ensued.

O'Rourke was accused of punching one person in the face before pulling out a gun and firing three rounds. He pleaded guilty to first-degree manslaughter last week for killing Anton L. Hill, 33, with a shot to the head. Hill was a father of five.

## Support Saves Landmark

A nonprofit affordable housing development and property management company that builds housing for low-income families announced Thursday that it will be constructing and rehabilitating 108 affordable housing units in Portland and Hillsboro.

Reach Community Development received an award of nearly \$18 million in low income and affordable housing credits and grants. The award will be invested towards the Orchards at Orenco in Hillsboro and the Bronaugh Apartments in downtown Portland.

The Orchards will be the first affordable housing unit for low-income families at Orenco, and is being built with cost-effective construction techniques to lower heating and cooling requirements.

The Bronaugh serves elderly and disabled Portlanders living on fixed incomes. The first phase of construction for the Orchard at Orenco is expected to be in completed by June and the Bronaugh Apartment project will break ground in May.

## Week in The Review

### Student Stabbed to Death

A Linfield College athlete was stabbed and killed Saturday after a football game in McMinnville. The suspect was fatally shot by police during a confrontation immediately following the incident at a convenience store near the college campus. The victim, Parker Moore, was a sophomore Business Management major.

### Student Sex Videos Investigated

Portland police detectives are investigating reports that students at Grant High School recorded themselves having sex and then shared those videos to other students. Sharing videos of minors engaging in sex is a crime and Portland Police said the teens who shared the videos could face child porn-related charges.

### If Cleared, Ferguson Officer to Return to Duty

As protests continue in Ferguson, Mo., and across the country, following the police shooting of Michael Brown, the local police force has announced how it might respond to the grand jury's decision in the case. If the grand jury charges the officer, he would most likely be terminated from employ-

ment, otherwise he would be immediately reinstated, Chief Tom Jackson said.

### Health Exchange Crashes

Some people scrambled to sign up for healthcare on Saturday as open enrollment for the Affordable Care Act enters a second year. Hours into the market opening, the site temporarily crashed. Officials and software engineers were able to resolve the problems. Open enrollment for health care insurance companies will continue until Feb. 1.

### Bill Cosby Dodges Allegations

Comedian Bill Cosby retreated into silence as allegations that he sexually assaulted a woman several decades ago and other women in the past come back into the conversation over social media and in the news. A spokesman for the comedian said the allegations were false.

### First Cuddling Business

Samantha Hess opened her own unusual business over the weekend, a "Cuddle Up to Me" outlet on East Burnside, Portland's first ever cuddle shop, providing "platonically touch" services that help clients who are otherwise in need of human kindness. The shop has brought up significant controversy, and Hess says she struggled to find a location for her business due to its nature.
