## Week in The Review

### Senate Torture Report

The Senate Intelligence Committee released findings from their investigation into torture and the CIA's enhanced interrogation techniques Tuesday, saying that the agency's methods were not only ineffective at gathering necessary information, but that the CIA consistently misled Congress and the public about the program to keep it going.

### Ban on Federal Profiling

The Obama administration issued guidelines Monday that ban federal law enforcement from profiling on the basis of religion, national origin and other characteristics, protocols the Justice Department hopes could be a model for local departments as the nation tackles questions about the role race plays in policing.

### Heisman Trophy Favorite

Oregon quarterback Marcus Mariota was named one of four finalists Monday and is considered the front-runner to win the 80th Heisman on Saturday night in New York. He would become the first Oregon player to earn college football's most



famous player of the year trophy. Mariota and the second-seeded Ducks will face Florida State at Rose Bowl in the College Football Playoff semifinal on Jan. 1.

### Sentence in Cully Murder

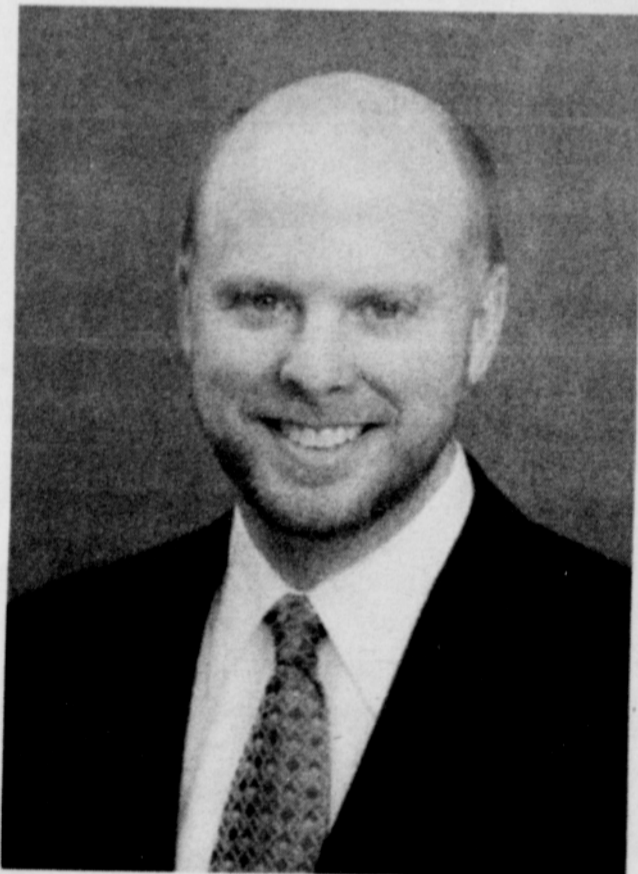
Lonnell Demarcus George, 24 was sentenced to 18 years in prison Thursday for the 2013 homicide of 18-year-old Edward Jewell Paden Jr. at a gas station in northeast Portland's Cully Neighborhood. George pled guilty to charges of manslaughter and being a felon in possession of a firearm.

### Cocaine Transport Busted

On Friday around 7 a.m., Portland Police stopped a minivan heading north on I-205 around the Portland Airport. Upon searching the vehicle, officers located 42 kilograms of cocaine, which investigators now believe was destined for Canada. The driver was arrested.

### Satellite Radio Company Settles

Oregon Attorney General Ellen Rosenblum announced Thursday that she has joined other states in a \$3.8 million settlement with Sirius XM Radio resolving claims that the satellite radio company engaged in misleading advertising and billing practices. Any Oregonian who thinks they were wrongfully billed should submit a claim with the Oregon Attorney General's office.

## County Adopts \$15 Minimum Wage

Multnomah County has adopted a \$15 minimum wage for its employees. The county's board of commissioners approved the wage hike on Thursday. It will be phased in over the next three years.

The county agreed to the minimum wage as part of its new contract with union workers. Commissioners voted to extend it to nonunion workers as well, including temporary and on-call employees such as election and library workers.

Officials say about 500 workers will benefit. That's 9 percent of the county's workforce. The increase will cost about \$675,000 over the next three years.
