Liv Warfield wins Soul Train award

Portland powerhouse vocalist Liv Warfield closes out the year by clutching a highly coveted Soul Train award for Best Contemporary Jazz Performance.

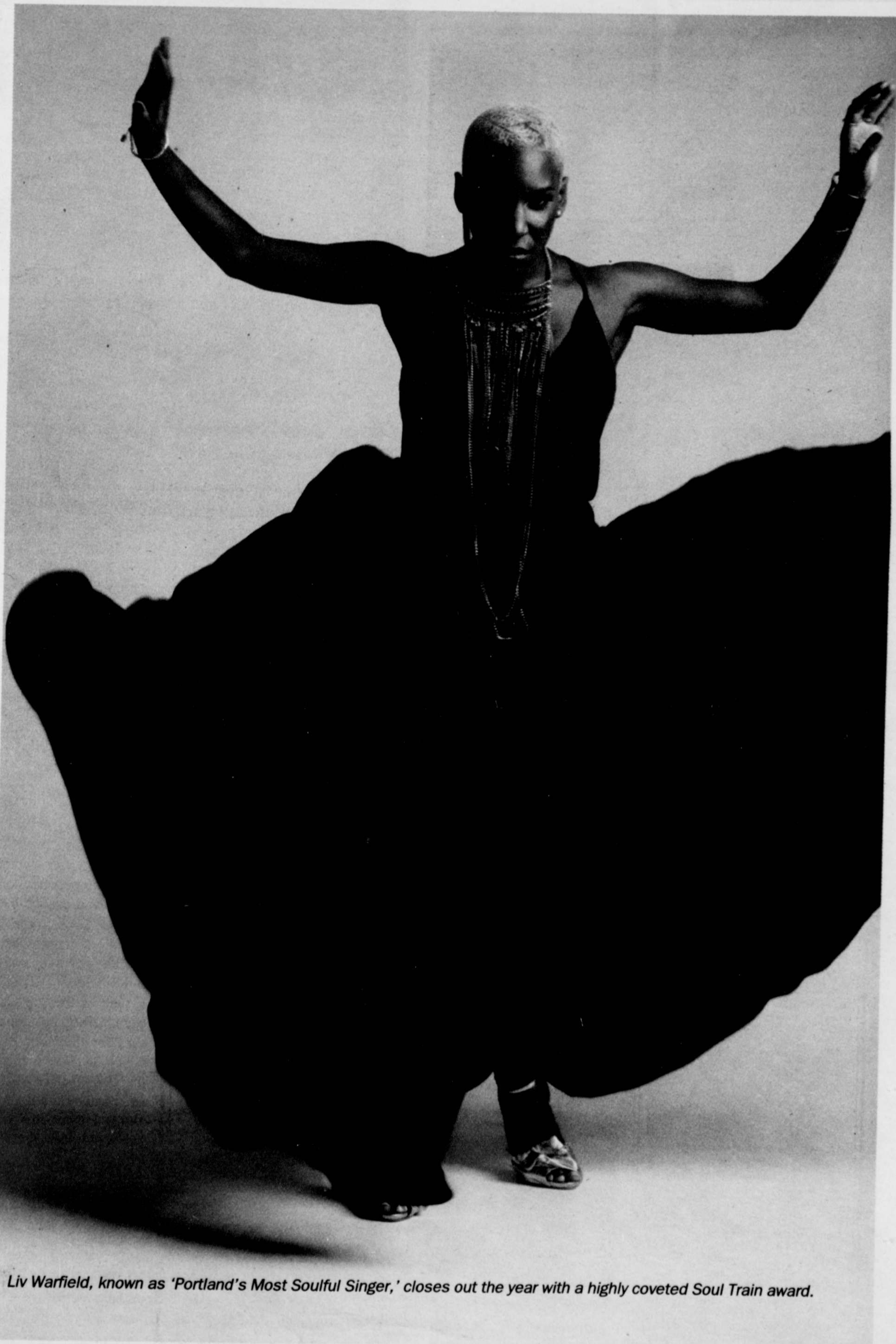
The 35-year-old R&B and soul performer, known as "Portland's Most Soulful Singer" got her professional start in the Rose City. A native of Peoria, Ill., she has been a member of Prince's band "New Power Generation" for the past few years.

"Stay - Soul Lifted" is the song that won her the Soul Train award. She was also nominated for Best Independent R&B/Soul Performance for her rendition of "Why Do You Lie?" and Best New Artist.

Warfield also just finished a busy weekend, performing in New York City's legendary Beacon Theater at Cyndi Lauper's annual star-studded show, Home for the Holidays, a benefit concert.

She performed alongside such luminaries as 50 cent, Natalie Maines, Patty Griffin, Sufjan Stevens, Rob Thomas, and Salt-N-Pepa. The show was hosted by LGBT activists Rosie O'Donnell and Laverne Cox.
