ners,” Shola Lynch’s 2002 documentary on activist Angela Davis shows on Sunday, Feb. 8 at 7:30 p.m. Davis, an outspoken UCLA professor whose affiliation with the Communist Party and the Black Panthers lands her on the FBI’s 10 Most Wanted list chal-

lenges our perceptions of political freedom in America.

“Just Another Girl on the I.R.T.” screens on Sunday, Feb. 15 at 7:30 p.m. The 1992 film is about a high schooler determined not to become “just another girl on the IRT” (one of NYC’s subway lines). She dreams of medical school, a family, and an escape from her family’s

poverty, but personal and sexual challenges confront her.


“Soul Train Express: The Sisters” shows Wednesday, Feb. 18 at 7:30 p.m. Co-presented with Re-Run Theater, this program culls hours of “Soul Train” performances into the best of the female singers or female-fronted bands of the 1970s and early ’80s. Featuring inspirational performances by Tina Turner, Aretha Franklin, Diana Ross, Donna Summer, Chaka Khan, and more.

“Black Girl in Suburbia” (2015) shows on Saturday, Feb. 21 at 2 p.m. The documentary by Portland filmmaker Melissa Lowery examines the experiences of black girls growing up in predominantly white communities. Through professional and personal interviews, the film explores the conflicts and issues black girls have relating to both white and black communities. Director Lowery will be in attendance.
